What is staying the same? What is changing?
The dispensation from Sunday Mass obligation will remain in place. Mass attendance remains voluntary. Those who do not feel safe, or who have compromising health conditions, should not attend. Sacred Heart will continue with our modified Mass schedule.

Weekday Mass--Tuesday and Thursday at 8 am
Weekend Mass--Saturday 5 pm & Sunday 9 am
There will continue to be <u>limited seating capacity</u>
available in the Church. The Green Phase Part I
guidelines allow for an increased capacity of *up to*50% of the Church capacity, dependent on

configuration and size of pews. At Sacred Heart, every other pew is now open for seating, compared to every third pew, so our seating capacity increases to 50 persons per Mass/service.

- † Seating will only be on the ends of the open pews, with no more than 3 persons per pew (excluding families). Ushers will assist with seating for weekend Masses.
- † Our current seating capacity inside the Church at any one time will be limited to 50.
- † Due to capacity limits, we will have a **reservation**

process in place for Weekend Masses. Please call the Parish Office no earlier than Monday at 8:00 am and no later than Friday at noon before the weekend Mass to reserve a seat for one of the two weekend Masses. Once our seating capacity is reached, that Mass will be deemed "full" and you will need to wait to attend one of the following weekend or daily Masses. When you arrive to Church the ushers will make sure you are on the reservation list for that Mass. Please

be patient as we all work through this process.

THE PRO-LIFE CORNER

In 2019, a major anti-abortion film was released in theaters. The film was entitled <u>Unplanned</u>. It was based on a book written by Abby Johnson Abby Johnson, who was once one of the abortion industry's most passionate advocates, gives us an insiders view of Planned Parenthoods workings. She is now one of the Pro-Life's movements most prominent advocates. She had two abortions herself before her conversion, and now lives in Texas with her husband and seven children.

Unlike some "Christian" based films, <u>Unplanned</u> was cinematically very well done. The acting was very good, and the story line was easy to follow. There was none of the "hokey" language often portrayed in these type of films. Despite this, I believe there was a concerted effort by the movie industry to limit its distribution. The Regal Northampton Cinema in Easton off Route 248 was one of the few local movie theaters to show the film.

Freda and I went to see it on a weekday afternoon. There was a smallish audience, mostly, I think, retired people about our age. All through the film, an older gentlemen, who was attending alone, quietly wept. The film was pretty graphic about the reality of abortion, and how the young women were coerced in going through with the abortions even if they were not sure about it.

Something happened in the theater at the end of the movie. Something we had never experienced before. No one left during the credits. Everyone just sat there, stunned, while the elderly gentleman continued to weep. Finally we all got out of our chairs and left in silence. No matter where you stand on the abortion issue, this film is worth seeing. Especially for those who believe that a Christian can have an abortion or collaborate with it, in good conscience. It is available on some streaming channels, as well as on DVD's.

9 September 2020 THE ROLE OF CONSCIENCE IN VOTING

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Voting is a solemn civic ceremony that has been won and defended by the blood of countless American men and women throughout our Nation's history, up to the present day. Please exercise this precious right. For the Catholic, voting also has grave moral obligations and consequences. Voting can never be taken lightly nor be contrary to a well-formed conscience.

A "well-formed conscience" for the Catholic is one that has been formed under the guidance of the Holy Spirit through prayer, studying Scripture, and honestly informing oneself about the moral teachings of the Catholic Church. In 2002, Joseph Cardinal Ratzinger (later Pope Benedict XVI) wrote, "Democracy must be based on the true and solid foundation of non-negotiable ethical principles, which are the underpinning of life in society." (Doctrinal Note on Some Questions Regarding the Participation of Catholics in Political Life, 2002, no. 3) While there is no initiative on the part of the Church to support one candidate over another, it is an indispensable obligation of bishops, priests, and deacons to inform the faithful about the hierarchy of issues that must be considered in conscience by every voting Catholic.

In consistent Catholic teaching, recently re-affirmed by our Holy Father, Pope Francis, and the body of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops, abortion and euthanasia are the "preeminent" issues in forming an opinion about how to vote. "...[T]he right to health, to home, to work, to culture is false and illusory if the right to life, the most basic and fundamental right and the condition for all other personal rights, is not defended with maximum determination." (Pope John Paul II, Christifideles Laici, 1998, no. 38, emphasis in the original)

Hence, a Catholic voter is to approach the ballot box with the defense of innocent human life uppermost in his/her mind and conscience. As voters, we must carefully examine our consciences to determine if our vote cooperates with a candidate's promotion of the grave sins of abortion and euthanasia. The United States Bishops gave stark guidance to politicians in 1998, "No public official, especially one claiming to be a faithful and serious Catholic, can responsibly advocate for or actively support direct attacks on innocent human life." (Living the Gospel of Life: A Challenge for American Catholics, no. 32) While this statement addresses public officials once elected to office, in intellectual and moral honesty, we must extend these words to us citizens who, by our vote, elect the candidate to office.

Admittedly, the coming elections pose many challenges and much soul-searching for Catholic voters. There never are, and are not now, perfect candidates for office. Most likely for us, none completely matches our desires on temperament, social justice, immigration, or foreign, domestic, or economic policies. For this reason, the Church offers guidance for Catholic voters in correctly forming their consciences, especially on the overriding, foundational issues of abortion and euthanasia.

Some may see these words of guidance as an intrusion into the political arena. To the contrary, the Church and her bishops have a serious obligation and right to participate in public discourse and to assist the faithful in properly forming their consciences to be able to participate fully, with free and informed will, in the moral and civic act of voting.

Please pray to the Holy Spirit for guidance as you prepare to cast your vote, and God bless you for participating in such a profound American tradition.

SACRAMENT OF ANOINTING OF THE SICK

is given to those who are seriously ill and in danger of death. When there is danger of death, please call the Pastor anytime, day or night.

GODPARENT/SPONSOR ELIGIBILITY FORMS

In order to act as a godparent for Baptism or a Sponsor for Confirmation, one must be a Catholic in good standing. Specifically this means Mass attendance every Sunday (Exodus 20:8), striving to live the moral precepts of the Church, and if married, a valid marriage in the Catholic Church.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

Parishioners who are contemplating the Sacrament of Matrimony should contact the Pastor and mutually agree upon a date at least a year prior to the Wedding. The Church takes the preparation for the Sacrament of Matrimony very seriously, and requires completion of the Diocesan Marriage Preparation Program six months before the wedding. The normative time for weddings is Saturday between 10:00 AM and 1:30 PM. Weddings are not celebrated on major holidays, nor on the first weekend of June in deference to Ordination of Priests each year at that time. Either the Bride or the Groom must be a practicing member of Sacred Heart Parish in order to request a wedding date.

COMMUNION TO THE HOMEBOUND

A Priest or Deacon will visit monthly. Extraordinary Ministers visit those who wish to receive more often. Always notify us about the homebound parishioners who wish to be visited.

THE SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

is celebrated on Sunday at Noon. If you are a parishioner and would like to schedule a Baptism, please contact the Parish Office. Prior to the baptism, parents must attend a Baptism Preparation Class which is designed to instruct the parents about the teachings of the church regarding Baptism, and to offer assistance in the spiritual preparation for their child's reception of the first of the Sacraments of the Church.

PARISH MEMORIALS

Following the death of a relative or friend, offerings may be made to the Church in loving memory of the deceased. Offerings may specify a particular request or be placed in the Memorial Fund for parish needs.
