GREEN PHASE-PART II EFFECTIVE OCTOBER 31, 2020

What is staying the same? What is changing?

The dispensation from Sunday Mass obligation will remain in place. Mass attendance remains voluntary. Those who do not feel safe, or who have compromising health conditions, should not attend. Sacred Heart will continue with our modified Mass schedule.

Weekday Mass--Tuesday and Thursday at 8 am Weekend Mass

Saturday 5 pm & Sunday 7am, 9 am, 11am

There will continue to be <u>limited seating capacity</u> available in the Church. The Green Phase Part II guidelines allow for an increased capacity of *up to* 50% of the Church capacity, dependent on configuration and size of pews. At Sacred Heart, every other pew is now open for seating, compared to every third pew, so our seating capacity increases to 60 persons per Mass/service.

<u>Reservations are still required</u> for the Saturday 5:00pm and Sunday 9:00am and 11:00am **weekend** Masses. <u>Reservations</u> are **NOT** required for Sunday 7:00 am Mass.

Long-handled baskets may be used to take up the offertory collection.

All other restrictions remain in place, including social distancing and face masks required.

HOW TO PREPARE FOR RETURNING TO MASS AND WHAT TO EXPECT

- † Please use the ramp door (back) for entrance/exit to the Church. The Church doors on Washington Street will remain locked.
- † Every second pew will be open for seating. Please honor the closed pew restrictions.
- † Seating will only be on the ends of the open pews, with no more than 4 persons per pew (excluding families). Ushers will assist with seating.
- † Our current seating capacity inside the Church at any one time will be limited to 60.
- † Due to capacity limits and demand, we have a reservation process in place for the Saturday 5:00 pm and Sunday 9:00 am and 11:00am Weekend Masses only. Please call the Parish Office no earlier than Monday at 8:00 am and no later than Friday at noon before the weekend Masses if you wish to reserve a seat for the Saturday 5 pm or Sunday 9 am Masses. Once our seating capacity is reached for those Masses, you will need to attend one of the other Masses on Sunday morning at 7 am or 11 am or daily Mass during the week. When you arrive to Church the ushers will make sure you are on the reservation list. Please be patient as we all work through this process.
- Please bring and wear your face mask while inside the Church. You will not be allowed in the building without a face mask.
- † Respect social distancing of at least 6 feet at all times, both inside and outside of Church.
- † Please use the provided hand sanitizer in the entrances and pews as needed.
- † Our ushers will help enforce these guidelines. Please respect instructions.
- † All hymnals and pamphlets/prayer cards have been temporarily removed from Church due to the difficulty of keeping them disinfected.

PRO-LIFE CORNER

Do capital punishment, social justice issues and immigration policies fall under "pro-life?" Are they equally as important as abortion and/or euthanasia?

They are not. Firstly, it doesn't make sense to lump these political issues with a moral issue that's as old as the ten commandments. "Thou shalt not kill." It is defined by the Catholic Church as the taking of "innocent human life", not "guilty human life" as defined by the proper authorities, nor animal life. Innocent human life. What can be more innocent than the baby in its mother's womb? It should be the safest place in the world for that child, but has become the most dangerous.

Capital punishment has always been accepted by the Church and the Bible. In fact St. Thomas Aquinas called it "not only acceptable but commendable." Pope Francis recently rephrased Church teaching on the topic and declared capital punishment "inadmissible" with no further definition of the term. In our times it has become debatable. Be that as it may, abortion is never debatable.

Secondly, putting other issues under the Pro-Life banner tends to confuse and water down the antiabortion issue. I know certain pro-abortion elements in our society always refer to abortion as a political issue. It's not, it is a moral issue. Other issues such as capital punishment, immigration policies, etc. are and can be argued as political issues.

At a recent meeting of the United States Council of Catholic Bishops, a vote was taken on including other issues with abortion and euthanasia as Pro-Life. Two-thirds of the Bishops voted it down, and re-affirmed that abortion was the preeminent priority for the Catholic Church in the United States..

EMBER DAYS

During the Season of Lent, His Excellency, Most Reverend Alfred A. Schlert asks the clergy and faithful of the Diocese of Allentown to celebrate the Ember Days for the Season as a sign of reparation and healing for the Church. Ember Days are quarterly observances with three days set aside (Wednesday, Friday, and Saturday) to pray in gratitude for the blessings of the season and human labor, to thank God publicly. There are twelve Ember Days in all.

Holy Mother Church provides many opportunities to refresh and renew. The Lenten Ember Days blends with the season of Lent, providing reminders to continue and persevere in the spirit of conversion and penance. The fasting and abstinence would follow the current laws of the Church, with abstaining being from all meat, and fasting would be one full meal a day, with the allowance of two smaller meals that do not equal the main meal, and no eating between meals.

The Church no longer regularly ordains priests during the Quarterly Ember Days, but traditionally this is a special time, particularly Ember Saturday, to pray for priests and for seminarians.

The Lenten Ember Days for 2021 are as follows: Wednesday, February 24, Friday, February 26 and Saturday, February 27.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Lent began on Ash Wednesday, February 17. During this holy season, we're encouraged to repent of our sinfulness, to seek the Lord's forgiveness in the sacrament of reconciliation, and to grow closer to him through prayer and fasting. What's happening in our lives is mirrored in the Church: music is subdued, alleluia is not said or sung, and the use of flowers is not permitted. Many of you kindly arrange for flowers in memory of your loved ones. We will welcome that loving gesture after Easter.



GODPARENT/SPONSOR ELIGIBILITY FORMS

In order to act as a godparent for Baptism or a Sponsor for Confirmation, one must be a Catholic in good standing. Specifically this means Mass attendance every Sunday (Exodus 20:8), striving to live the moral precepts of the Church, and if married, a valid marriage in the Catholic Church.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

Parishioners who are contemplating the Sacrament of Matrimony should contact the Pastor and mutually agree upon a date at least a year prior to the Wedding. The Church takes the preparation for the Sacrament of Matrimony very seriously, and requires completion of the Diocesan Marriage Preparation Program six months before the wedding. The normative time for weddings is Saturday between 10:00 AM and 1:30 PM. Weddings are not celebrated on major holidays, nor on the first weekend of June in deference to Ordination of Priests each year at that time. Either the Bride or the Groom must be a practicing member of Sacred Heart Parish in order to request a wedding date.

COMMUNION TO THE HOMEBOUND

A Priest or Deacon will visit monthly. Extraordinary Ministers visit those who wish to receive more often. Always notify us about the homebound parishioners who wish to be visited.

THE SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

is celebrated on Sunday at Noon. If you are a parishioner and would like to schedule a Baptism, please contact the Parish Office. Prior to the baptism, parents must attend a Baptism Preparation Class which is designed to instruct the parents about the teachings of the church regarding Baptism, and to offer assistance in the spiritual preparation for their child's reception of the first of the Sacraments of the Church.
