





### **PRO-LIFE CORNER**

Continuation of Humanae Vitae, (Of Human Life) encyclical by Pope Paul VI: 1968

On page 9, the Pope makes the understatement of the century: "It can be foreseen that this teaching will perhaps not be easily received by all." He is being kind; he knew it would be rejected by most. The day before it was published in English, a group of theologians put out a statement in Washington D.C. rejecting Humane Vitae. One of our own Allentown Diocese priests at he time, since deceased, Rev. James Mulligan responded with a brilliant little booklet: "The Pope and The Theologians" rejecting their rejections of Humanae Vitae and establishing the reasons for his rejection.

The theologians' rejection, which has been used to justify many other intrinsically evil actions, was based on the conscience of the individual. Msgr. Mulligan replies to this argument on page 74: "The absurdity is in the implication that formation of conscience is a purely individual matter divorceable from the Christian community and the activity of the legitimate authority of the same community." In other words our consciences have to be properly formed through prayer and education, not through emotions and feelings.

However, and unfortunately, many more Catholics believed the confused theologians and the clergy who followed them than believed the Pope. Fifty years after Humanae Vitae an article published in the Wall Street Journal stated that only 2% of Catholic women never used birth control. And that only 13% agree with the Church's teaching about artificial birth control. Although agreeing that this togething will be

Although agreeing that this teaching will be very difficult to many, the Pope states: "To tell the truth, the Church is not surprised to be made like her divine founder, a "sign of contradiction" (Luke 2:34), yet she does not cease to proclaim with humble firmness the entire moral law, both natural and evangelical. In essence the Church cannot make up truths, or change the truth, "she is only their depository and their interpreter." Msgr. Mulligan adds in his defense of HV: "The real point is that the Church receives its faith infallibly and so it

says things are true because in fact, they are true.

Next week, Pope Paul makes an appeal to different groups of society to encourage the culture of life.

#### (Nine days) Novena to our Lord of Divine Mercy

Mercy Sunday is celebrated on April 11, 2021 at Sacred Heart Church after the 11:00am Mass to 3:00pm.

**Novena** starts on **Good Friday** and ends **Saturday** before the Feast of Mercy Sunday. Leaflets for the Novena and Chaplet of Divine Mercy are available at both entrances to the church.

#### Schedule is found below for those who wish to participate in the novena, nine days before Mercy Sunday in church or privately.

- † April 2 Day one Good Friday after the 3:00 services in community with the Lay Dominicans
- + April 3 Day two Saturday, privately
- + April 4,5,7,9 privately
- † April 6, 8, after 8:00 am Mass in community with the Lay Dominicans
- † April 9, Day Nine Friday, privately

# Please take advantage of Jesus' offering of this great grace of mercy for the salvation of our own souls and the souls of our loved ones.

#### **Requirements for the Novena**

- 1. Start praying the **novena and the Chaplet of Divine Mercy** on **Good Friday** You can pray it anytime during the day or join us in the church.
- 2. Say the prayer and intention for each day up to the ninth day as you see in the leaflet.
- 3. On the other side of the leaflet is the Chaplet of Divine Mercy. Say it each day along with the novena prayers using your rosary beads.
- 4. If you faithfully say the prayers each day, you will end up on the Saturday after Easter Sunday.
- 5. Go to **confession** and receive **Holy Communion** on Mercy Sunday. If confession is not possible on this day, you can go to confession eight (8) days before or eight (8) days after with the intention of fulfilling the requirement for this novena.

#### Spiritual benefits obtained from praying this Novena

You have total forgiveness from all the sins you have committed during your past life and forgiveness from all the punishments due to your sins after having made a good confession as seen in one of the above requirements for the Novena.

## Additional information about the devotion

- 1. This is a great grace of mercy and forgiveness Jesus is offering us for the salvation of our souls and the salvation of the souls of our loved ones.
- 2. Whoever will recite the chaplet will receive great mercy at the hour of death.
- 3. This prayer is very helpful at the death bed of our loved ones. Jesus promised that He will stand between God the Father and the dying person, not as a Judge but as a <u>Merciful Savior</u>.
- 4. Even the most hardened sinner who will say the Chaplet of Divine Mercy **even just once** will receive grace from God's infinite mercy.
- 5. Through the Chaplet, you will obtain everything you ask, for as long as it is compatible with God's will.
- 6. This prayer is with the Church's approval.

#### **GODPARENT/SPONSOR ELIGIBILITY FORMS**

In order to act as a godparent for Baptism or a Sponsor for Confirmation, one must be a Catholic in good standing. Specifically this means Mass attendance every Sunday (Exodus 20:8), striving to live the moral precepts of the Church, and if married, a valid marriage in the Catholic Church.

#### THE SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

is celebrated on Sunday at Noon. If you are a parishioner and would like to schedule a Baptism, please contact the Parish Office. Prior to the baptism, parents must attend a Baptism Preparation Class which is designed to instruct the parents about the teachings of the church regarding Baptism, and to offer assistance in the spiritual preparation for their child's reception of the first of the Sacraments of the Church.

#### SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

Parishioners who are contemplating the Sacrament of Matrimony should contact the Pastor and mutually agree upon a date at least a year prior to the Wedding. The Church takes the preparation for the Sacrament of Matrimony very seriously, and requires completion of the Diocesan Marriage Preparation Program six months before the wedding. The normative time for weddings is Saturday between 10:00 AM and 1:30 PM. Weddings are not celebrated on major holidays, nor on the first weekend of June in deference to Ordination of Priests each year at that time. Either the Bride or the Groom must be a practicing member of Sacred Heart Parish in order to request a wedding date.

#### **COMMUNION TO THE HOMEBOUND**

A Priest or Deacon will visit monthly. Extraordinary Ministers visit those who wish to receive more often. Always notify us about the homebound parishioners who wish to be visited.

#### **RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS**
