

PRO-LIFE CORNER

Continuation of Humanae Vitae, (Of Human Life) encyclical by Pope Paul VI: 1968

The Pope appealed to different groups with his encyclical message. Last week's article discussed his appeal to Educators and the Modern Media. This week's article focuses on the Pope's first appeals to "Public Authorities"; he states; "Do not allow the morality of your peoples to be degraded. Do not permit by legal means practices contrary to the natural and divine law be introduced into the fundamental cell -the family."

As you all know the family has come under attack by different governments. So called "same-sex marriage" (a term Pope Paul VI, would have never been able to imagine in 1968), has been legally accepted in our country and other traditional Christian countries. I would like to quote from an article by Rev. Msgr. Andrew Baker, an Allentown Diocesan priest, published in The A.D. Times, Dec. 9, 2010. After explaining God's plan for marriage, that is that marriage must be unitive and procreative, Msgr. Baker states: "Those who suffer from homosexual attractions have a right to marry. Yes, they have a right to marry. Proposing that marriage can only be between a man and woman does not deny them this right precisely because a union between two men or two women is not marriage. No one can have a right to something that cannot ever truly exist, no matter what judges or lawmakers say."

The Church is not indifferent to those who struggle with same sex attraction and there is a very effective agency within the Church to help those who do. It is called "COURAGE" and diocesan support resources are available, referred to in our bulletin regularly, at allentowndiocese.org/catholic-life-find-support/ministry-persons-same-sex-attractions/courage.

Many (if not most) politicians, by their actions, do not support marriage any longer. They are either directly against it as demonstrated by supporting laws that promote the homosexual/transgender agenda, or the proabortion agenda, or they are too timid to speak out against those agenda's for fear of being accused of lacking some sort of compassion.

More young couples are waiting longer to get married, if they decide to get married at all. Our society and these young couples need the witness of good marriages. Let us all be aware of the political ramifications of this issue when we exercise our right to vote. Elections have consequences. The Pope's warning to politicians that they "not permit by legal means practices contrary to the natural and divine law be introduced into the fundamental cell -- the family." has been ignored, to the detriment of our society.

GODPARENT/SPONSOR ELIGIBILITY FORMS

In order to act as a godparent for Baptism or a Sponsor for Confirmation, one must be a Catholic in good standing. Specifically this means Mass attendance every Sunday (Exodus 20:8), striving to live the moral precepts of the Church, and if married, a valid marriage in the Catholic Church.

THE SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

is celebrated on Sunday at Noon. If you are a parishioner and would like to schedule a Baptism, please contact the Parish Office. Prior to the baptism, parents must attend a Baptism Preparation Class which is designed to instruct the parents about the teachings of the church regarding Baptism, and to offer assistance in the spiritual preparation for their child's reception of the first of the Sacraments of the Church.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

Parishioners who are contemplating the Sacrament of Matrimony should contact the Pastor and mutually agree upon a date at least a year prior to the Wedding. The Church takes the preparation for the Sacrament of Matrimony very seriously, and requires completion of the Diocesan Marriage Preparation Program six months before the wedding. The normative time for weddings is Saturday between 10:00 AM and 1:30 PM. Weddings are not celebrated on major holidays, nor on the first weekend of June in deference to Ordination of Priests each year at that time. Either the Bride or the Groom must be a practicing member of Sacred Heart Parish in order to request a wedding date.

COMMUNION TO THE HOMEBOUND

A Priest or Deacon will visit monthly. Extraordinary Ministers visit those who wish to receive more often. Always notify us about the homebound parishioners who wish to be visited.

RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS


