

PRO-LIFE CORNER

Continuation of Humane Vitae, (Of Human Life) encyclical by Pope Paul VI: 1968

The Pope continues to appeal to different groups to accept his encyclical. This week we will look at his appeal to "Christian Husbands and Wives." He starts by reminding us that Marriage is a sacrament, and its purpose is to be witnesses to the world by living their vocation of marriage "to perfection." A Christian marriage is supposed to be a model of the Church's relationship to Christ. The Holy Father quotes St. Paul in his the letter to the Ephesians, Ch. 5; "Husbands love your wives, as Christ loved the Church...husbands should love their wives as their own bodies. He who loves his wife loves himself. For no man ever hates his own flesh, but nourishes and cherishes it, as Christ does the Church...this is a great mystery, and I mean in reference to Christ and the Church. However, let each one of you love his wife as himself and let his wife see that she respects her husband."

He recommends that husbands and wives "implore divined assistance" in accomplishing this task by frequent partaking of the Holy Eucharist and the sacrament of penance. The general divorce rate in the United States has leveled off at around 50%. Unfortunately, the reason it has leveled off is that fewer couples are actually getting married any more and when they do they are usually well into the 30's. The general divorce rate among Catholics is no different than the rest of the population.

However, for those Catholic couples who attend Church weekly together the divorce rate is about 2%. So the sacrament of marriage brings along with it tremendous grace but as with all of the sacraments we must cooperate with that grace through our actions and choices.

The Pope ends this section to married couples by encouraging them to evangelize and socialize with other committed married Catholic couples in the many postulates offered by the Church. Freda and I found our way back to the Church in our late 20's through such movements as "Marriage Encounter", The "Catholic Charismatic Renewal" and "Couples for Christ." We saw and found the value in keeping close contact with other couples like ourselves. Movements like these come and go but keeping involved in the parish is one thing you can always do. We have a very active parish, and I would suggest that for all those who want to build their faith to go beyond weekly Mass attendance and get involved with one or more of the many groups that serve and support the parish. Read the bulletin and determine which of the groups you would like to join.

Action Needed for Born-Alive Act

The Born-Alive Abortion Survivors Protection Act (H.R. 619) has again been introduced in Congress to protect babies from infanticide. But efforts to bring the bill to a vote in the House are being blocked. Your action is needed to urge your Representative to sign a discharge petition that would allow this vote to occur. Some states have passed laws to expand abortion and to repeal laws providing specific protections for babies born alive after surviving an attempted abortion. The Born-Alive Act would provide these specific protections nationwide to help prevent newborns from being killed or left alone to die. We must continue to push Congress to pass the Born-Alive Act, so babies born alive following an abortion attempt are treated the same as any other newborn baby. PLEASE ACT TODAY!!! GODPARENT/SPONSOR ELIGIBILITY FORMS

In order to act as a godparent for Baptism or a Sponsor for Confirmation, one must be a Catholic in good standing. Specifically this means Mass attendance every Sunday (Exodus 20:8), striving to live the moral precepts of the Church, and if married, a valid marriage in the Catholic Church.

THE SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

is celebrated on Sunday at Noon. If you are a parishioner and would like to schedule a Baptism, please contact the Parish Office. Prior to the baptism, parents must attend a Baptism Preparation Class which is designed to instruct the parents about the teachings of the church regarding Baptism, and to offer assistance in the spiritual preparation for their child's reception of the first of the Sacraments of the Church.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

Parishioners who are contemplating the Sacrament of Matrimony should contact the Pastor and mutually agree upon a date at least a year prior to the Wedding. The Church takes the preparation for the Sacrament of Matrimony very seriously, and requires completion of the Diocesan Marriage Preparation Program six months before the wedding. The normative time for weddings is Saturday between 10:00 AM and 1:30 PM. Weddings are not celebrated on major holidays, nor on the first weekend of June in deference to Ordination of Priests each year at that time. Either the Bride or the Groom must be a practicing member of Sacred Heart Parish in order to request a wedding date.

COMMUNION TO THE HOMEBOUND

A Priest or Deacon will visit monthly. Extraordinary Ministers visit those who wish to receive more often. Always notify us about the homebound parishioners who wish to be visited.

RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS
