

UPDATED COVID GUIDELINES

The Diocese provided updated guidelines for celebration of Divine Worship with the Presence of the Faithful, effective May 1. The requirement to wear face masks, practice social distancing and proper hand hygiene remain in place. We still need to keep every other pew in Church closed, so the seating capacity at Sacred Heart remains We will continue to require reservations for the Saturday 5:00 pm and Sunday 9:00 am Masses.

- -1-2 altar servers per Mass are now allowed.
- -Communion call visits to the homebound will resume. Please contact the parish office if you have a need and want to be added to the list.
- -Lectors are now permitted to remain in the Sanctuary during the Mass.



PRO-LIFE CORNER

Continuation of Humanae Vitae, (Of Human Life) encyclical by Pope Paul VI: 1968

This week we will look at the Pope's appeal to "Doctors and Medical Personnel."

"We hold those physicians and medical personnel in the highest esteem who, in the exercise of their profession, value above every human interest the superior demands of their Christian vocation." The Pope pleads that these professionals will give those married couples who consult them "wise counsel and healthy direction."

As far as I can discern in my 44 years visiting physicians as a pharmaceutical sales rep and in my married experience of having 6 children there are unfortunately very few physicians, Catholic or otherwise who will not prescribe birth control pills or other sorts of contraception such as vasectomies. We were able to find the few who would not use contraceptives in their practice because they were also the ones who would not refer their patients to the abortionist. Also, since our friends were primarily against the use of contraceptives, word would get around quickly which OB-GYNS would not prescribe the pill.

Ironically those few physicians who would not go against the Church's teachings on contraception had thriving practices, since they were in the minority and many Christians would seek them out. So they were financially blessed by sticking to their convictions although their decision was not based on financial considerations. That is usually the way God works!

In addition, their patients were blessed by avoiding the perils of taking the birth control pill and possibly suffering from their side effects, and of course, by having the greatest blessings of all; children. To put things in perspective, I have the greatest admiration for those in the Medical profession; in fact, I owe my life to them, having had open heart bypass surgery 7 years ago.

I don't think I ever called on a physician that would perform an abortion but I know many Catholic physicians who had no compunction about performing a vasectomy or prescribing birth control pills probably because the practice is so widely accepted in our culture. Let us pray for our Catholic doctors, pharmacist and the rest of the medical profession including Pharmaceutical companies that they are able to trust God and make the right decisions in this sensitive area of their profession.

Next week we look into the ultimate group the Pope pleads with; Priests and Bishops.

ACTION NEEDED FOR BORN-ALIVE ACT

The Born-Alive Abortion Survivors Protection Act (H.R. 619) has again been introduced in Congress to protect babies from infanticide. But efforts to bring the bill to a vote in the House are being blocked. Your action is needed to urge your Representative to sign a discharge petition that would allow this vote to occur. Some states have passed laws to expand abortion and to repeal laws providing specific protections for babies born alive after surviving an attempted abortion. The Born-Alive Act would provide these specific protections nationwide to help prevent newborns from being killed or left alone to die. We must continue to push Congress to pass the Born-Alive Act, so babies born alive following an abortion attempt are treated the same as any other newborn baby. PLEASE ACT TODAY!!! GODPARENT/SPONSOR ELIGIBILITY FORMS

In order to act as a godparent for Baptism or a Sponsor for Confirmation, one must be a Catholic in good standing. Specifically this means Mass attendance every Sunday (Exodus 20:8), striving to live the moral precepts of the Church, and if married, a valid marriage in the Catholic Church.

THE SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

is celebrated on Sunday at Noon. If you are a parishioner and would like to schedule a Baptism, please contact the Parish Office. Prior to the baptism, parents must attend a Baptism Preparation Class which is designed to instruct the parents about the teachings of the church regarding Baptism, and to offer assistance in the spiritual preparation for their child's reception of the first of the Sacraments of the Church.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

Parishioners who are contemplating the Sacrament of Matrimony should contact the Pastor and mutually agree upon a date at least a year prior to the Wedding. The Church takes the preparation for the Sacrament of Matrimony very seriously, and requires completion of the Diocesan Marriage Preparation Program six months before the wedding. The normative time for weddings is Saturday between 10:00 AM and 1:30 PM. Weddings are not celebrated on major holidays, nor on the first weekend of June in deference to Ordination of Priests each year at that time. Either the Bride or the Groom must be a practicing member of Sacred Heart Parish in order to request a wedding date.

COMMUNION TO THE HOMEBOUND

A Priest or Deacon will visit monthly. Extraordinary Ministers visit those who wish to receive more often. Always notify us about the homebound parishioners who wish to be visited.




