

<u>UPDATED COVID GUIDELINES</u> EFFECTIVE AUGUST 15, 2021

- In concert with the other Bishops in Pennsylvania, the obligation to attend Mass on weekends and Holy
 Days is returning effective August 15th. See letter from Bishop Schlert in today's bulletin.
- There are no longer any seating or capacity restrictions in the Church. All pews are open again and <u>reservations are no longer needed</u> for any Mass!
- No one is required to wear a facemask on diocesan property. Those who wish to continue to wear one are free to do so.
- The Exchange of the Sign of Peace is not permitted.
- Effective the week of August 16th, all daily Masses will be held in Church with the exception of Wednesday 8 am Mass, which will continue to be said by Father in his private chapel and livestreamed for those homebound parishioners.
- With the exception of these items, most other liturgical restrictions are relaxed/eliminated.



THE PRO-LIFE CORNER

On October 26, 1985, Mother Teresa of Calcutta addressed the United Nations assembly to give a talk on peace. Here is part of what she said:

"...Works of love begin at home and works of love are works of peace, and yet we are frightened of nuclear war, we are frightened of this new disease. But we are not afraid to kill an innocent child, that little unborn child, who has been created for that same purpose to love God and love you and me...

"...That in our countries that terrible law of killing the innocents, of destroying life, destroying the presence of God, be removed from our country, from our nation, from our people, from our families."

As she made these remarks, you could hear a pin drop, until suddenly the whole assembly rose to their feet in a tumultuous applause of approval. There was sitting, proudly, in the front row, a number of our proabortion American politicians who had no choice but to rise with everyone else. I am sure Mother was praying for their conversion at that moment. She knew they were there, and she knew where they stood on the life issues.

We should also know where those in power stand on the life issues, and be able, like this frail elderly woman, to speak the truth in love and power. With the grace of God we can and must.

FOOD BANK DONATION UPDATE

Due to your generous donations of non-perishable items, on Thursday, July 1, our parish's council of the Knights of Columbus delivered 321 pounds of items to the St. Vincent De Paul Food Bank at St. Paul's Church in Allentown. This represents the first delivery for the 2021-2022 fraternal year; (July 1, 2021-June 30, 2022). The next delivery of donated items will be made, as soon as the bins are full, to the Cay-Galgon Life Center in Bethlehem. The Supreme Council of the Knights of Columbus donates \$100, up to \$500 annually, to local councils for each 1,000 pounds of food delivered to local food banks. During the past fiscal year, our council delivered 3,394 pounds of items and qualified for a \$300 rebate from Supreme Council. Once received, this rebate will be split among the food banks we support. Thank you for your past donations and please continue to donate, if you are able, since there continues to be a very great need from local families. Also, please check the "best by' date on all food items before donating as the food banks cannot accept any items with a "best by" date earlier than 2020.



ST. IGNATIUS OF LOYOLA

(Patron Saint of prayer and retreat)

The founder of the Jesuits was on his way to military fame and fortune when a cannon ball shattered his leg. Because there were no books of romance on hand during his convalescence, Ignatius whiled

away the time reading a life of Christ and lives of the saints. His conscience was deeply touched, and a long, painful turning to Christ began. Having seen the Mother of God in a vision, he made a pilgrimage to her shrine at Montserrat near Barcelona. He remained for almost a year at nearby Manresa, sometimes with the Dominicans, sometimes in a pauper's hospice, often in a cave in the hills praying. After a period of great peace of mind, he went through a harrowing trial of scruples. There was no comfort in anything—prayer, fasting, sacraments, penance. At length, his peace of mind returned.

WELCOME

We welcome all who join us at our Mass. We encourage you to become an active participant in the life of our Parish. All Catholics who live within our Parish boundaries should register. Please call the Parish Office for more information.

SACRAMENT OF ANOINTING OF THE SICK

is given to those who are seriously ill and in danger of death. When there is danger of death, please call the Pastor anytime, day or night.

GODPARENT/SPONSOR ELIGIBILITY FORMS

In order to act as a godparent for Baptism or a Sponsor for Confirmation, one must be a Catholic in good standing. Specifically this means Mass attendance every Sunday (Exodus 20:8), striving to live the moral precepts of the Church, and if married, a valid marriage in the Catholic Church.

THE SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

is celebrated on Sunday at Noon. If you are a parishioner and would like to schedule a Baptism, please contact the Parish Office. Prior to the baptism, parents must attend a Baptism Preparation Class which is designed to instruct the parents about the teachings of the church regarding Baptism, and to offer assistance in the spiritual preparation for their child's reception of the first of the Sacraments of the Church.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

Parishioners who are contemplating the Sacrament of Matrimony should contact the Pastor and mutually agree upon a date at least a year prior to the Wedding. The Church takes the preparation for the Sacrament of Matrimony very seriously, and requires completion of the Diocesan Marriage Preparation Program six months before the wedding. The normative time for weddings is Saturday between 10:00 AM and 1:30 PM. Weddings are not celebrated on major holidays, nor on the first weekend of June in deference to Ordination of Priests each year at that time. Either the Bride or the Groom must be a practicing member of Sacred Heart Parish in order to request a wedding date.

COMMUNION TO THE HOMEBOUND

A Priest or Deacon will visit monthly. Extraordinary Ministers visit those who wish to receive more often. Always notify us about the homebound parishioners who wish to be visited.

RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS

Those who desire entrance into the Catholic Church are warmly welcome through the **RCIA**. Please contact the Pastor for more information.


