

FORTY HOURS DEVOTIONS

Sacred Heart's annual celebration of Forty Hours will take place Sunday, Monday and Tuesday, November 14, 15 and 16. The Blessed Sacrament will be exposed after the closing prayer of the 11:00 AM Mass on Sunday. The Church will be open for adoration Sunday afternoon, as well as throughout the night Sunday and Monday, and following 8:00 am Mass on Monday and Tuesday. We invite and encourage you to spend time before our Lord and Savior, present in the Eucharist. Adoration sign-up sheets are posted in the ramp entrance vestibule.

The format for the 6:30 PM devotions will be evening prayer, followed by Benediction. Father Jeff Whorton will serve as homilist. Father Whorton is an active duty U.S. Army Chaplain stationed at Fort Hood, Texas and currently serves as the Garrison Duty Chaplain.

- Adoration continues throughout the night, with simple reposition before Mass on Monday and Tuesday mornings

Monday, November 15

- Exposition/Adoration prior to Confession and after daily Mass
- 8:00 AM Mass
- Rosary at 12:00 Noon
- 6:30 PM Forty Hours Devotion/Benediction with Evening Prayer, homilist, Father Jeff Whorton
- Confessions following devotions
- Adoration continues throughout the night, with simple reposition before Mass on Tuesday morning.

Tuesday, November 16

- Exposition/Adoration prior to Confession and after daily Mass
- 8:00 AM Mass
- Rosary at 12:00 Noon
- 6:30 PM Forty Hours Closing Devotion, Procession with the Most Blessed Sacrament, Benediction, Reposition, Evening Prayer with homilist Father Jeff Whorton.
