UPDATED COVID GUIDELINES

EFFECTIVE AUGUST 15, 2021

- In concert with the other Bishops in Pennsylvania, the obligation to attend Mass on weekends and Holy Days returned effective August 15th.
- Effective the week of August 16th, all daily Masses will be held in Church.
- There are no longer any seating or capacity restrictions in the Church. All pews are open again and reservations are no longer needed for any Mass!
- Ushers are now required to wear a facemask when greeting parishioners and when taking up the collection. Masks are also required for the priest, deacon or Eucharistic Minister at the distribution of Communion. Face masks are not required for anyone else on diocesan property. Those who wish to continue to wear one are free to do so.
- The Exchange of the Sign of Peace is not permitted.
- With the exception of these items, most other liturgical restrictions are relaxed/eliminated.

THE RECEPTION OF SACRAMENTS

The location where you receive your sacraments is governed by the territorial boundaries of the Parish within which you live, as prescribed by the Code of Canon Law. As a reminder, and to prevent delay or confusion when the time nears the sacraments (and sacramental preparation), reception is not governed by where one attends school nor by where you attend Mass nor receive Religious Education. For example, if you live in the territorial boundaries of Sacred Heart of Jesus Parish, and your 2nd grader attends Good Shepherd School in Northampton, they will receive their Religious Education from Good Shepherd School, but receive the sacrament of First Holy Communion at Sacred Heart. If you have any questions, please contact the Parish Office and we will be glad to assist you. Thank you!

PRO-LIFE CORNER

Hold on to your seats! The Pro-Life issues are flying high. We are closer to having the infamous Roe vs. Wade Supreme Court decision from 1973 reversed. The court has just finished hearing Dobbs vs. Jackson Women's Health Organization case, and the judges' comments would indicate that the majority of the court will vote in favor of Dobbs. No quarantees however.

The case, if won, would allow Mississippi to restrict abortions after 15 weeks. The present law, theoretically, restricts abortions after 24 weeks. I say theoretically, because, as I have explained here before, Doe vs. Bolton, which was decided the same day as Roe vs. Wade, allowed abortions after 24 weeks for reasons of health, and the life of the mother. Unfortunately, for the babies, the term "health" was interpreted to include; mental, physical, economic etc. so that any reason could be imagined to allow an abortion up to the very moment of birth. So, the gruesome "partial birth" abortion procedure became possible and legal.

The final decision will not be known until the end of the Supreme Court's present sessions which will end in June 2022. Keep in mind that if we get a favorable decision the battle is not over but will move from the Federal level to the State level.

We vote for a new Governor in Nov.2022, let's pray for a pro-life governor for the State of Pennsylvania. It will be nice to hear more crying babies at Mass.

GODPARENT/SPONSOR ELIGIBILITY FORMS

In order to act as a godparent for Baptism or a Sponsor for Confirmation, one must be a Catholic in good standing. Specifically this means Mass attendance every Sunday (Exodus 20:8), striving to live the moral precepts of the Church, and if married, a valid marriage in the Catholic Church.

THE SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

is celebrated on Sunday at Noon. If you are a parishioner and would like to schedule a Baptism, please contact the Parish Office. Prior to the baptism, parents must attend a Baptism Preparation Class which is designed to instruct the parents about the teachings of the church regarding Baptism, and to offer assistance in the spiritual preparation for their child's reception of the first of the Sacraments of the Church.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

Parishioners who are contemplating the Sacrament of Matrimony should contact the Pastor and mutually agree upon a date at least a year prior to the Wedding. The Church takes the preparation for the Sacrament of Matrimony very seriously, and requires completion of the Diocesan Marriage Preparation Program six months before the wedding. The normative time for weddings is Saturday between 10:00 AM and 1:30 PM. Weddings are not celebrated on major holidays, nor on the first weekend of June in deference to Ordination of Priests each year at that time. Either the Bride or the Groom must be a practicing member of Sacred Heart Parish in order to request a wedding date.

COMMUNION TO THE HOMEBOUND

A Priest or Deacon will visit monthly. Extraordinary Ministers visit those who wish to receive more often. Always notify us about the homebound parishioners who wish to be visited.
