

UPDATED COVID GUIDELINES

EFFECTIVE MARCH 6, 2022

- In concert with the other Bishops in Pennsylvania, the obligation to attend Mass on weekends and Holy Days returned effective August 15th, 2021
- Effective the week of August 16th, 2021 all daily Masses will be held in Church.
- There are no longer any seating or capacity restrictions in the Church. All pews are open again and reservations are no longer needed for any Mass!
- There are no longer any facemask requirements for anyone, including Ushers taking up the collection.
 Masks are also not required for the priest, deacon or Eucharistic Minister during the distribution of Holy Communion. Those who wish to wear a facemask are, of course, free to do so.
- The Exchange of the Sign of Peace is not permitted.
- All other liturgical restrictions are relaxed/ eliminated.



EASTER SUNDAY RESURRECTION OF OUR LORD

There is no room for doubt but the eleven disciples, had thought that the sad events of Good Friday had put an end forever to the mission of love and mercy of their beloved Master. In spite of His previous references to His resurrection, did



PRO-LIFE CORNER

Another State has passed legislation to limit abortions. Oklahoma has passed a bill that would prohibit most abortions within its borders; "A person shall not purposely perform or attempt to perform an abortion except to save the life of a pregnant woman in a medical emergency." The penalty for breaking this law is a \$100,000 fine and 10 years in prison. Note that the person being punished is the abortionist not the pregnant woman.

The governor of Oklahoma still has to sign it into law. He has promised in the past that he would approve any legislature that is pro-life. This will also affect Texas as well, since Texas has a very restrictive anti-abortion law in place, and those Texans who wanted an abortion have been traveling to Oklahoma.

The Supreme Court will decide sometime in June to uphold or reject the Mississippi abortion restrictions. If it goes as expected, this ruling can "undermine or repeal" Roe vs. Wade, and thereby send the abortion issue back to the individual States where it should have remained.

The NRTL, (National Right to Life) organization has vowed to be prepared to carry on their mission wherever it leads and however the Supreme Court decision goes. Keep in mind that the Federal Congress can pass laws that have the power to restrict the rights of the States, even if Roe vs. Wade is repealed. In fact, the House just passed a pro-abortion bill, cleverly called; "Women's Health Protection Act," which would make abortion legal at all stages of the pregnancy. Fortunately, it is highly unlikely that the Senate will pass it.

DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY

What graces are available and how do we receive them?

In her Diary, St. Faustina records a special promise given to her by Jesus. He told her to communicate it to the whole world:

My daughter, tell the whole world about My inconceivable mercy. I desire that the Feast of Mercy be a refuge and shelter for all souls, and especially for poor sinners. I pour out a whole ocean of graces upon those souls who approach the fount of My mercy (699).

In three places in her Diary, St. Faustina records our Lord's promises of specific, extraordinary graces:

I want to grant a complete pardon to the souls that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion on the Feast of My mercy (1109). Whoever approaches the Fountain of Life on this day will be granted complete forgiveness of sins and punishment (300). The soul that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion will obtain complete forgiveness of sins and punishment (699).

To receive these graces, the only condition is to receive Holy Communion worthily on Divine Mercy Sunday (or the Vigil celebration) by making a good confession on Divine Mercy Sunday or 8 days before or after with the intention of fulfilling the requirement for the novena and staying in the state of grace and trusting in His Divine Mercy. By these conditions, our Lord is emphasizing the value of confession and Holy Communion as miracles of mercy. The Eucharist is Jesus, Himself, the Living God, longing to pour Himself as Mercy into our hearts. In addition, our Lord says through St. Faustina that we are to perform acts of mercy: "Yes, the first Sunday after Easter is the Feast of Mercy, but there must also be acts of mercy" (742). "The graces of My mercy are drawn by means of one vessel only, and that is trust. The more a soul trusts, the more it will receive" (1578).

The worthy reception of the Eucharist on Divine Mercy Sunday is sufficient to obtain the extraordinary graces promised by Jesus. A plenary indulgence, obtained by fulfilling the usual conditions, also is available.

The Divine Mercy Novena starts on April 15th after Good Friday services, continues privately on the 16th and 17th, in community after weekday Mass Monday April 18th through Friday April 22nd, and ends privately on the 23rd, day nine. Divine Mercy Sunday is April 24th and the celebration will begin after the 11:00 am Mass with Exposition of the Most Blessed Sacrament, the Rosary, 1:00 Confessions, Divine Mercy meditations, and concluding at 3:00 PM with the Chaplet of Divine Mercy and Benediction. Look for the Divine Mercy Novena prayer pamphlets in the Church Vestibule. Please take advantage of Jesus' offering of this great grace of mercy!

THE RECEPTION OF SACRAMENTS

The location where you receive your sacraments is governed by the territorial boundaries of the Parish within which you live, as prescribed by the Code of Canon Law. As a reminder, and to prevent delay or confusion when the time nears for the sacraments (and sacramental preparation), reception is not governed by where one attends school nor by where you attend Mass nor receive Religious Education. For example, if you live in the territorial boundaries of Sacred Heart of Jesus Parish, and your 2nd grader attends Good Shepherd School in Northampton, they will receive their Religious Education from Good Shepherd School, but receive the sacrament of First Holy Communion at Sacred Heart. SACRAMENT OF ANOINTING OF THE SICK

is given to those who are seriously ill and in danger of death. When there is danger of death, please call the Pastor anytime, day or night.

GODPARENT/SPONSOR ELIGIBILITY FORMS

In order to act as a godparent for Baptism or a Sponsor for Confirmation, one must be a Catholic in good standing. Specifically this means Mass attendance every Sunday (Exodus 20:8), striving to live the moral precepts of the Church, and if married, a valid marriage in the Catholic Church.

THE SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

is celebrated on Sunday at Noon. If you are a parishioner and would like to schedule a Baptism, please contact the Parish Office. Prior to the baptism, parents must attend a Baptism Preparation Class which is designed to instruct the parents about the teachings of the church regarding Baptism, and to offer assistance in the spiritual preparation for their child's reception of the first of the Sacraments of the Church.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

Parishioners who are contemplating the Sacrament of Matrimony should contact the Pastor and mutually agree upon a date at least a year prior to the Wedding. The Church takes the preparation for the Sacrament of Matrimony very seriously, and requires completion of the Diocesan Marriage Preparation Program six months before the wedding. The normative time for weddings is Saturday between 10:00 AM and 1:30 PM. Weddings are not celebrated on major holidays, nor on the first weekend of June in deference to Ordination of Priests each year at that time. Either the Bride or the Groom must be a practicing member of Sacred Heart Parish in order to request a wedding date.

COMMUNION TO THE HOMEBOUND

A Priest or Deacon will visit monthly. Extraordinary Ministers visit those who wish to receive more often. Always notify us about the homebound parishioners who wish to be visited.

RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS
