




## NOTICE SANCTUARY CANDLE INTENTIONS

If you would like to memorialize a candle at the shrine of the Blessed Mother or Saint Joseph or at the Tabernacle, please call or visit the parish office during office hours. Candles burn from Friday through the following Thursday. A Mass will be said for all the memorialized intentions.

#### **CONCECRATION TO THE HOLY FAMILY**

On Friday, December 30<sup>th</sup>, the Church celebrates the Feast of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph. At the daily Mass on Friday as well as the Masses on Saturday, Dec. 31<sup>st</sup> and Sunday, Jan. 1st, we will formally pray to consecrate our families under the protection of the Holy Family. A major aspect of this program is serious and meaningful preparation for at least a week prior to the consecration. Toward this end, the consecration prayer is included at the end of this message. Please use it as part of your family's preparation. Four suggested steps before praying the Consecration to the Holy Family are as follows:

- 1. Discuss the importance of this consecration as a family and why you are doing it.
- 2. Each member of your family is encouraged to go to the sacrament of reconciliation.
- 3. As a family, choose something to fast from. The fast can be for at least a week. As our physical bodies are drawn to things of this world, it is strongly encouraged that you fast from something you would normally do or consume. Fasting helps to discipline our minds and hearts to refrain from secular activities and be more focused on God.
- 4. Prepare for the commitment you are making. Consecration to the Holy Family is not a single event. You have chosen a way of life for your family. You and your family are consciously choosing to be a beacon of light of God's love through his Church.

At all Masses, concertation prayer cards will be in the pews. After use, please leave them there for use at the next Mass.

#### THE BIRTH OF CHRIST

Now this is how the birth of Jesus Christ came about. When his mother Mary was betrothed to Joseph, but before they lived together, she was found with child through the Holy Spirit. As a reminder, and to prevent delay or confusion when the time nears for the sacraments (and sacramental preparation), reception is not governed by where one attends school nor by where you attend Mass nor receive Religious Education. For example, if you live in the territorial boundaries of Sacred Heart of Jesus Parish, and your 2nd grader attends Good Shepherd School in Northampton, they will receive their Religious Education from Good Shepherd School, but receive the sacrament of First Holv Communion at Sacred Heart. #### GODPARENT/SPONSOR ELIGIBILITY FORMS

In order to act as a godparent for Baptism or a Sponsor for Confirmation, one must be a Catholic in good standing. Specifically this means Mass attendance every Sunday (Exodus 20:8), striving to live the moral precepts of the Church, and if married, a valid marriage in the Catholic Church.

#### THE SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

is celebrated on Sunday at Noon. If you are a parishioner and would like to schedule a Baptism, please contact the Parish Office. Prior to the baptism, parents must attend a Baptism Preparation Class which is designed to instruct the parents about the teachings of the church regarding Baptism, and to offer assistance in the spiritual preparation for their child's reception of the first of the Sacraments of the Church.

#### SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

Parishioners who are contemplating the Sacrament of Matrimony should contact the Pastor and mutually agree upon a date at least a year prior to the Wedding. The Church takes the preparation for the Sacrament of Matrimony very seriously, and requires completion of the Diocesan Marriage Preparation Program six months before the wedding. The normative time for weddings is Saturday between 10:00 AM and 1:30 PM. Weddings are not celebrated on major holidays, nor on the first weekend of June in deference to Ordination of Priests each year at that time. Either the Bride or the Groom must be a practicing member of Sacred Heart Parish in order to request a wedding date.

#### **COMMUNION TO THE HOMEBOUND**

A Priest or Deacon will visit monthly. Extraordinary Ministers visit those who wish to receive more often. Always notify us about the homebound parishioners who wish to be visited.

#### RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS


