#### SUNDAY READINGS JANUARY 8TH

<u>First Reading</u> -- Rise up in splendor, Jerusalem! Your light has come, the glory of the Lord shines upon you. (Is 60:1-6)

<u>Psalm</u> — "Lord, every nation on earth will adore you." (*Ps 72:1-2, 7-8, 10-11, 12-13*)

<u>Second Reading</u> -- Brothers and sisters: You have heard of the stewardship of God's grace that was given to me for your benefit, namely, that the mystery was made known to me by revelation. (*Eph 3:2-3a*, 5-6)

<u>Gospel</u> — When Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea, in the days of King Herod, behold, magi from the east arrived in Jerusalem, saying, "Where is the newborn king of the Jews? (Mt 2:1-12)

## THE BAPTISM OF THE LORD Feast Day—January 9th

At Jesus baptism <u>God the Father</u> spoke from heaven, God the Son was baptized, and God the <u>Holy Spirit</u> descended on Jesus like a dove.

Jesus was sinless; he did not need cleansing. No, the act of baptism was part of Christ's mission in coming to earth. Like previous

priests of God — Moses, Nehemiah, and Daniel — Jesus was confessing sin on behalf of the people of the world. Likewise, he was endorsing John's ministry of baptism.

Jesus' baptism was unique. It was different from the "baptism of repentance" that John had been performing. It was not a "Christian baptism" as we experience today. Christ's baptism was a step of obedience at the beginning of his public ministry to identify himself with John's message of repentance and the revival movement it had begun.

By submitting to the waters of baptism, Jesus linked himself with those who were coming to John and repenting. He was setting an example for all of his followers as well.

Jesus baptism was also part of his preparation for Satan's temptation in the wilderness. Baptism was a foreshadowing of Christ's death, burial, and resurrection. And lastly, Jesus was announcing the beginning of his ministry on earth.

John had devoted his life to preparing for the arrival of Jesus. He had focused all of his energy on this moment. His heart was set on obedience. Yet, the very first thing Jesus asked him to do, John resisted.

John resisted because he felt unqualified, unworthy to do what Jesus had asked. Do you feel inadequate to fulfill your mission from God? John felt unworthy even to unfasten the shoes of Jesus, yet Jesus said John was the greatest of all prophets (Luke 7:28). ). How many times do we hear the word of God and question the message sent to us. Don't let your feelings of inadequacy hold you back from listening to God's words and your appointed mission.

#### **EPIPHANY OF THE LORD**

#### **JANUARY 6, 2023**

As with the Three Kings, Pope Francis said, "the experience of God does not block us, but frees us; it does not imprison us, but puts us back on our way, returning us to the usual places of our existence. The places are the same but, after the encounter with Christ, we are not the same as before."

To worship like the Magi did, is "to bring gold to the Lord and to tell him that nothing is more precious than He is. To offer Him incense and to tell Him that only in union with Him can our lives rise up to heaven. To present Him with myrrh, balm for the bruised and wounded, and to promise Him that we will aid our marginalized and suffering neighbors in whom He Himself is present," the pope said.

Like the Magi, Christians discover the meaning of their life's journey in worshipping the Lord and it brings them great joy.

#### **EPIPHANY TRADITIONS**

It is traditional for parish priests to bless water on Epiphany, which is used for the blessing of homes that day. Chalk for each family is also blessed so that they may mark the names of the three Magi over their doors, as a witness of their faith and protection against evil.

Father Butera will bless water and chalk for Epiphany on <u>Sunday, January 15th at 8:45 am</u> prior to the 9:00 am Mass.

With chalk, families write an inscription on the lintel above the front door. The series of numbers, letters, and crosses changes only slightly from year to year. For example, at the start of the year 2023, the line will read as follows:

#### 20+C+M+B+23

The four digits designating the New Year appear at the beginning and end of the line. Because Epiphany comes so near the beginning of the New Year, the numbers represent an annual renewal of God's blessing.

The letters have two meanings. They are the initials of the traditional names of the Magi: Caspar, Melchior and Balthazar. They also abbreviate the Latin words "Christus mansionem benedicat." "May Christ bless the house." The letters recall the day on which the inscription is made, as well as the purpose of blessing.

The crosses represent Christ, whom we invoke, and the saintliness of the magi. The inscription is made above the front door, so that all who enter and depart this year may enjoy God's blessing. The month of January still bears the name of the Roman god Janus, the doorkeeper of heaven and patron of the beginning and end of things. This blessing adds a Christian dimension to the traditional observance of the first month. The inscription is made of chalk, a product of clay, which recalls the human nature taken by God's Eternal Word in this holy season.

#### SACRAMENT OF ANOINTING OF THE SICK

is given to those who are seriously ill and in danger of death. When there is danger of death, please call the Pastor anytime, day or night.

#### GODPARENT/SPONSOR ELIGIBILITY FORMS

In order to act as a godparent for Baptism or a Sponsor for Confirmation, one must be a Catholic in good standing. Specifically this means Mass attendance every Sunday (Exodus 20:8), striving to live the moral precepts of the Church, and if married, a valid marriage in the Catholic Church.

#### THE SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

is celebrated on Sunday at Noon. If you are a parishioner and would like to schedule a Baptism, please contact the Parish Office. Prior to the baptism, parents must attend a Baptism Preparation Class which is designed to instruct the parents about the teachings of the church regarding Baptism, and to offer assistance in the spiritual preparation for their child's reception of the first of the Sacraments of the Church.

#### SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

Parishioners who are contemplating the Sacrament of Matrimony should contact the Pastor and mutually agree upon a date at least a year prior to the Wedding. The Church takes the preparation for the Sacrament of Matrimony very seriously, and requires completion of the Diocesan Marriage Preparation Program six months before the wedding. The normative time for weddings is Saturday between 10:00 AM and 1:30 PM. Weddings are not celebrated on major holidays, nor on the first weekend of June in deference to Ordination of Priests each year at that time. Either the Bride or the Groom must be a practicing member of Sacred Heart Parish in order to request a wedding date.

#### COMMUNION TO THE HOMEBOUND

A Priest or Deacon will visit monthly. Extraordinary Ministers visit those who wish to receive more often. Always notify us about the homebound parishioners who wish to be visited.

#### RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS

Those who desire entrance into the Catholic Church are warmly welcome through the **RCIA**. Please contact the Pastor for more information.

#### **CONSOLATION MINISTRY**
