THE MOST HOLY NAME OF JESUS Feast Day—January 3rd



Mary and Joseph did not sit across from each other at the kitchen table in the evenings debating a name for their child. They didn't flip through the pages of a book of saints or bounce ideas off of their friends and family. The baby's name was chosen for them by God Himself. Mary and Joseph did not disobey God's voice. The Archangel Gabriel announced to Mary, "Behold, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you will name him Jesus" (Lk 1:31).

And Joseph had a dream in which the angel told him, "She will bear a son and you are to name him Jesus, because he will save his people from their sins. (\underline{Mt} 1:21).

The Gospel of Luke further relates that "When eight days were completed for his circumcise, he was named Jesus, the name given by the angel before he was conceived in the womb" (Lk 2:21).

Jesus was named eight days after Christmas, January 3rd. The New Testament is filled with incidents where the name of Jesus is invoked to drive out devils, cure illnesses, and perform miracles. The Holy Name is explicitly exalted by Saint Paul: "at the name of Jesus every knee should bend, in heaven and on earth, and under the earth..." (Philippians 2:10).

Jesus reinforces the power of His own name in St. John's Gospel: "On that day you will not question me about anything. Amen, amen, I say to you, whatever you ask the Father in my name he will give you." (Jn 16:23).

FOOD BANK DONATION UPDATE

Due to the generosity of our Sacred Heart parishioners and the residents of Regency Creekside Meadows, our Council of the Knights of Columbus delivered 260 pounds of non-perishable items to the Bath Area Food Bank December 13 AND 310 pounds of non-perishable items to the St Vincent de Paul Food Bank December 8; these are the seventh and eighth donations for our Council's 2022-2023 fraternal year, bringing the total year-to-date to 1,587 pounds. Our next donation will be made to the St Vincent de Paul Food Bank in mid-January. Supreme Council of the Knights of Columbus rebates \$100, up to \$500 annually, to local Councils for each 1,000 pounds of food delivered. This rebate is then passed on by our Council to the Food Banks; THANK YOU for your past donations. The need in our communities is still great with current economic conditions; please continue to support this worthwhile endeavor.

Please check the "Best By" date on all food items before donating, we cannot accept items with a "Best By" date earlier than 2021.

PRO-LIFE CORNER

We received a Christmas card this past week from the Cay Galgon Life House. This is the Crisis pregnancy center that the parish supports with the baby bottles campaign. There is a very nice picture of some of the new mommies on the front of it.

One of the "mommies" looked just like a new bank teller at the Bank we use. On my last visit there I asked if she was familiar with the Cay Galgon organization. She was very familiar with it, and in fact that was her and her beautiful baby on the front of the card. I don't know the details of her situation and she did not volunteer what they were, but she made it crystal clear how appreciative she was of the Cay Galgon crisis pregnancy center, and of the help she received there throughout her pregnancy.

Sometimes our efforts in the pro-life cause, either praying in front of an abortion clinic, marching in Washington D.C. and/or Harrisburg, or giving a donation could seem pretty remote. It gave me a lot of gratification and hope to talk to this young woman about her direct experience with the pro-life center that we, here at Sacred Heart Church help support. Hopefully, for those of you who filled up those baby bottles, this little story will do the same.

SAINT ELIZABETH ANN SETON

Feast Day-January 4th

Saint Elizabeth was born Elizabeth Ann Bayley in New York City on August 28, 1774. She was raised as a devout Episcopalian. Her father was a physician and she grew up with riches and affluent social circles. At age 19 she married a handsome,



wealthy businessman, William Magee Seton. Her husband's business went bankrupt and her family moved in with her father. Her mother, sister and father, died which devastated Elizabeth. After Elizabeth sailed to Italy with her husband and eldest daughter, her husband died of tuberculosis. She was a widow at age 29, penniless and raising 5 children, two of whom died at a young age. While in Italy, Elizabeth visited Catholic Churches. She eventually felt called to convert to Catholicism seeing the faith in action through family friends. She became Catholic because....she came to believe in the Real Presence. She had a devotion to our Blessed Mother. In March 1805 she entered the Catholic Church. She was rejected by many family and friends because of her decision to become Catholic. Elizabeth opened a school in Baltimore to support her children. Elizabeth's sister-inlaw also became Catholic and together they started the first Sisters of Charity community in the U.S. in 1809 in Emmitsburg, Maryland. Its school was the first free Catholic school in America. This humble beginning marked the start of the Catholic parochial school system in the United States. The Sisters of Charity focused on education, children and the poor. Elizabeth established the first Catholic orphanage in the country, Saint Joseph's Asylum in Philadelphia.. She also established schools in and around Emittsburg, Maryland. She died of tuberculosis on January 4, 1821 at the age of 46. Elizabeth Ann Seton's remains are entombed in the National Shrine of Saint Elizabeth Ann Seton in Emmitsburg, Maryland.

As a reminder, and to prevent delay or confusion when the time nears for the sacraments (and sacramental preparation), reception is not governed by where one attends school nor by where you attend Mass nor receive Religious Education. For example, if you live in the territorial boundaries of Sacred Heart of Jesus Parish, and your 2nd grader attends Good Shepherd School in Northampton, they will receive their Religious Education from Good Shepherd School, but receive the sacrament of First Holy Communion at Sacred Heart. GODPARENT/SPONSOR ELIGIBILITY FORMS

In order to act as a godparent for Baptism or a Sponsor for Confirmation, one must be a Catholic in good standing. Specifically this means Mass attendance every Sunday (Exodus 20:8), striving to live the moral precepts of the Church, and if married, a valid marriage in the Catholic Church.

THE SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

is celebrated on Sunday at Noon. If you are a parishioner and would like to schedule a Baptism, please contact the Parish Office. Prior to the baptism, parents must attend a Baptism Preparation Class which is designed to instruct the parents about the teachings of the church regarding Baptism, and to offer assistance in the spiritual preparation for their child's reception of the first of the Sacraments of the Church.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

Parishioners who are contemplating the Sacrament of Matrimony should contact the Pastor and mutually agree upon a date at least a year prior to the Wedding. The Church takes the preparation for the Sacrament of Matrimony very seriously, and requires completion of the Diocesan Marriage Preparation Program six months before the wedding. The normative time for weddings is Saturday between 10:00 AM and 1:30 PM. Weddings are not celebrated on major holidays, nor on the first weekend of June in deference to Ordination of Priests each year at that time. Either the Bride or the Groom must be a practicing member of Sacred Heart Parish in order to request a wedding date.

COMMUNION TO THE HOMEBOUND

A Priest or Deacon will visit monthly. Extraordinary Ministers visit those who wish to receive more often. Always notify us about the homebound parishioners who wish to be visited.

RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS
