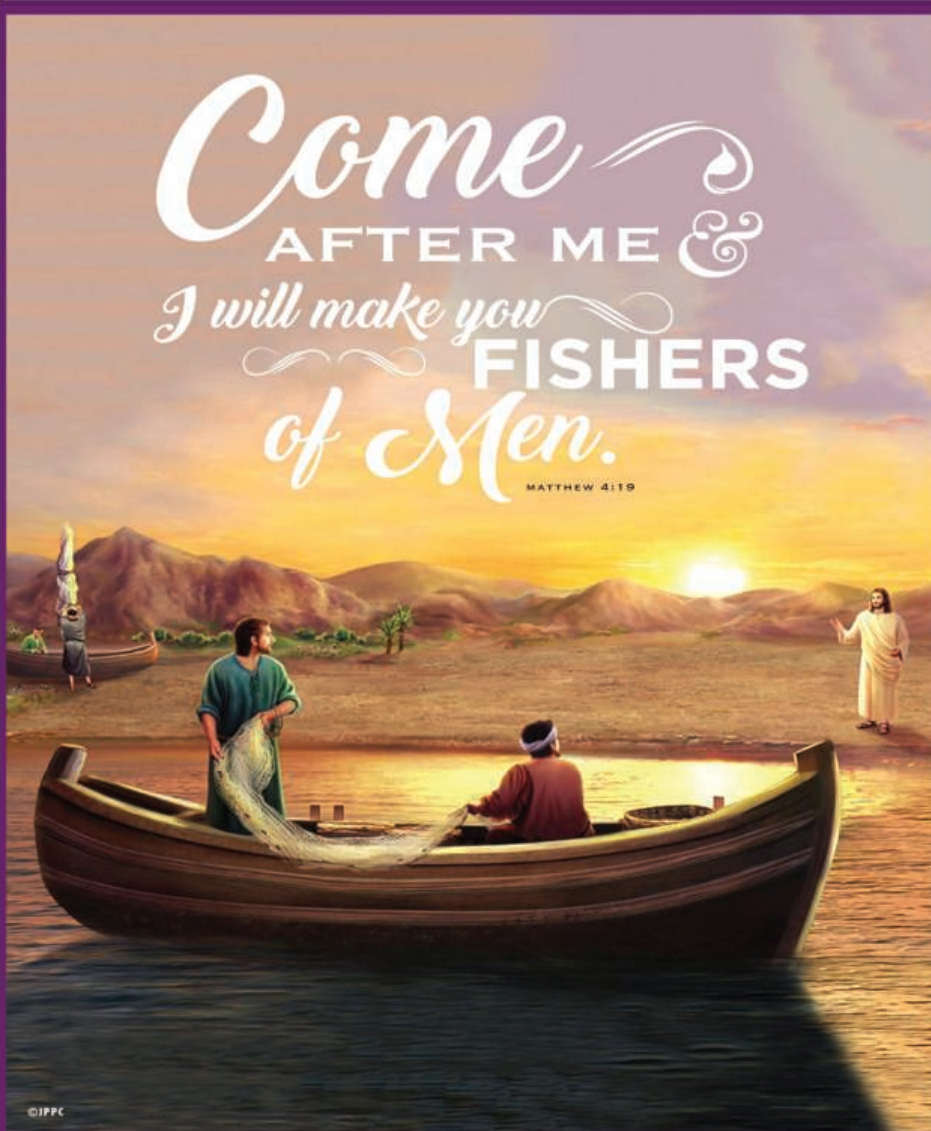

**ST. TIMOTHY, BISHOP**  
**(Feast Day—January 26th)**

St. Timothy, the beloved disciple of St. Paul, was of Lycaonia, and probably of the city of Lystra. His father was a Gentile, but his mother Eunice was a Jew. She, with Lois his grandmother, embraced the Christian religion, and St. Paul commends their faith. Timothy was converted and a close companion of St. Paul.

**Saint Timothy's – Warning Against Useless Disputes:**

Remind people of these things and charge them before God to stop disputing about words. This serves no useful purpose since it harms those who listen. Be eager to present yourself as acceptable to God, a workman who causes no disgrace, imparting the word of truth without deviation. Avoid profane, idle talk, for such people will become more and more godless, and their teaching will spread like gangrene. Among them are Hymenaeus and Philetus, who have deviated from the truth by saying that [the] resurrection has already taken place and are upsetting the faith of some. Nevertheless, God's solid foundation stands, bearing this inscription. "The Lord knows those who are his" and, "Let everyone who calls upon the name of the Lord avoid evil." (2 Timothy 2:14-19)

**Read the writings of St. Timothy. His words will give you some beautiful and spiritual advice on how we should live our life as God would want us...**

*Saints Timothy and Titus, you were called by God to share in the apostolic ministry of St. Paul, to go forth to preach, and to draw many souls to Heaven. Your faith, zeal, and countless virtues assisted you in this mission. Please pray for me, that I may also share in the apostolic work of the Church and help bring many souls to Christ. Saints Timothy and Titus, pray for me. Jesus, I trust in You. Amen*



**ST. TITUS, BISHOP**  
**(Feast Day – January 26th)**

St. Titus was a Greek, not a Jew, most likely born and raised on the island of Crete. Tradition states that he was educated in Greek philosophy and poetry as a youth. After Sts. Paul and Barnabas completed their first missionary journey, they traveled to Jerusalem to help resolve a dispute over whether or not a Gentile who converted to Christianity should be accepted. Paul invited Titus to join him in Jerusalem, perhaps in part because Titus was a Gentile convert. Titus became a close companion of St. Paul during those early years of the Church. With Titus' assistance, St. Paul prevailed at the Council of Jerusalem by convincing the others to accept Gentile converts. This was a huge decision that opened the door widely to the Gentiles, inviting them to freely enter.

Titus was also sent far and wide by St. Paul. After St. Paul had difficulties with the new members of the Church in Corinth, he sent Titus to them to restore the peace. Titus was also sent to assist in Jerusalem, eventually becoming the first bishop of Crete.

Saint Paul entrusted his letters to Titus giving instructions in pastoral ministry to his disciple as he prepared to meet up with him. St. Paul was arguably one of the greatest evangelists in the history of the Church, but he could not have accomplished all that he did on his own. Trusted co-workers like St. Timothy and St. Titus were essential to the mission.

**As we honor their lives, consider the ways that God wants you to act as a co-worker in the vineyard of this world. In the end, all that will matter is your faith and love in our Lord. God wants to use you, as He used these great apostles, to continue the good work of bringing the Gospel to the ends of the earth.**

PRO-LIFE CORNER

Elections matter! Florida's abortions were down 14.5% this past month, after their pro-life governor signed a law banning abortions past 15 weeks. Would have been nice to have been a ban on all abortions, but it is certainly better than what we will see here in Pennsylvania, since our newly elected governor is clearly pro-abortion. Pray for him. He seems to be a practicing Jew, but he takes the pro-abortion, "practicing" Catholic's hypocritical stance that he will not "impose" his religious beliefs on anyone. I wish he would, since religious orthodox Jews are one hundred percent anti-abortion.

During the pro-life marches in Washington D.C. I always looked forward to the Rabbi's talk. He always started with the blowing of the shofar. The shofar is a musical horn, typically made of a ram's horn. It has a further meaning: "Awake, you slobberers, from your sleep, and rouse yourselves from your lethargy, search your deeds, return in repentance." Following the blowing of the shofar, the Rabbi, (I don't remember his name), would give an impassioned anti-abortion speech. Always one of the best of the day. It's encouraging to know that we are not alone in our fight for life.

**DAY OF PRAYER FOR THE LEGAL PROTECTION  
OF UNBORN CHILDREN—Monday, January 23rd**

When we fail to acknowledge as part of reality the worth of a poor person, a human embryo, a person with disabilities — to offer just a few examples — it becomes difficult to hear the cry of nature itself; everything is connected. Once the human being declares independence from reality and behaves with absolute dominion, the very foundations of our life begin to crumble, for "instead of carrying out his role as a cooperator with God in the work of creation, man sets himself up in place of God and thus ends up provoking a rebellion on the part of nature" (*Pope John Paul II, Encyclical Letter Centesimus Annus, May 1, 1991*)....

When the human person is considered as simply one being among others, the product of chance or physical determinism, then "our overall sense of responsibility wanes" (*Pope Benedict XVI, Message for the 2010 World Day of Peace*)....

Human beings cannot be expected to feel responsibility for the world unless, at the same time, their unique capacities of knowledge, will, freedom, and responsibility are recognized and valued....

Since everything is interrelated, concern for the protection of nature is also incompatible with the justification of abortion. How can we genuinely teach the importance of concern for other vulnerable beings, however troublesome or inconvenient they may be, if we fail to protect a human embryo, even when its presence is uncomfortable and creates difficulties? "If personal and social sensitivity toward the acceptance of the new life is lost, then other forms of acceptance that are valuable for society also wither away" (*Pope Benedict XVI, Encyclical Letter Caritas in Veritate, June 29, 2009*)....

*Dear Heavenly Father, You have placed a love for preborn babies in the hearts of so many of us. Help us spread this love throughout our country. Help us teach the sanctity of human life to those who neither see nor understand it. Guide us as we work to protect all babies from abortion. Teach us to show Your compassion to both mothers and their babies so that they come to understand the meaning of selfless love. And please hold all Your children safe in Your arms. In Your holy name, we pray. Amen.*

**SAINT ANGELA MERICI (Feast Day—January 27th)**

St. Angela Merici was an Italian saint who founded the Ursulines and dedicated her life to educating girls. Angela Merici was born on March 21st, 1474, in Desenzano, Lombardy, Italy near Lake Garda. Angela became an orphan at ten years of age, and she and her sister went to Salo, where they were taken in by their uncle. Their household was devout, but tragically Angela's older sister died, causing great grief to Angela, since she died without Last Rites, but in a vision God granted her the knowledge that her sister was indeed in Heaven. Angela became a Third Order Franciscan and consecrated her virginity to God.

Angela returned to her hometown of Desenzano after the death of her uncle, when she was twenty years old. Many Catholic girls in her town and in Brescia were ignorant of their faith and basic learning, and the Holy Ghost led Angela to teach them. She taught out of her home and focused first on the spiritual formation of the girls: prayer and the sacraments. She established a school in these towns.

During a pilgrimage to the Holy Land in 1524, she was struck blind. But she prayed before the Crucifix on her way home, and God granted her sight back to her. Our Lord made Angela to understand that she must never be blind to the needs of those around her, especially girls in need of schooling.

In 1535, St Angela started the Order of the Ursulines with twelve young women who also had consecrated their virginity to God and His Church. Angela taught the girls to help them in their vocations to marriage and to religious life, and she taught them in their own homes so that the family would be the foundational place for their education. Her Order remained in their own homes, not in a convent, a first for the Church, and it was the first teaching Order made up of women. St Angela became the Mother of the Order, and the rule that she made for her sisters was approved by Pope Paul III in 1544. Since her Ursuline Order had no formal religious habit, St Angela died wearing the habit of a Franciscan tertiary.

The location where you receive your sacraments is governed by the territorial boundaries of the Parish within which you live, as prescribed by the Code of Canon Law. As a reminder, and to prevent delay or confusion when the time nears for the sacraments (and sacramental preparation), reception is not governed by where one attends school nor by where you attend Mass nor receive Religious Education. For example, if you live in the territorial boundaries of Sacred Heart of Jesus Parish, and your 2nd grader attends Good Shepherd School in Northampton, they will receive their Religious Education from Good Shepherd School, but receive the sacrament of First Holy Communion at Sacred Heart. is given to those who are seriously ill and in danger of death. When there is danger of death, please call the Pastor anytime, day or night.

**GODPARENT/SPONSOR ELIGIBILITY FORMS**

In order to act as a godparent for Baptism or a Sponsor for Confirmation, one must be a Catholic in good standing. Specifically this means Mass attendance every Sunday (Exodus 20:8), striving to live the moral precepts of the Church, and if married, a valid marriage in the Catholic Church.

**THE SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM**

is celebrated on Sunday at Noon. If you are a parishioner and would like to schedule a Baptism, please contact the Parish Office. Prior to the baptism, parents must attend a Baptism Preparation Class which is designed to instruct the parents about the teachings of the church regarding Baptism, and to offer assistance in the spiritual preparation for their child's reception of the first of the Sacraments of the Church.

**SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE**

Parishioners who are contemplating the Sacrament of Matrimony should contact the Pastor and mutually agree upon a date at least a year prior to the Wedding. The Church takes the preparation for the Sacrament of Matrimony very seriously, and requires completion of the Diocesan Marriage Preparation Program six months before the wedding. The normative time for weddings is Saturday between 10:00 AM and 1:30 PM. Weddings are not celebrated on major holidays, nor on the first weekend of June in deference to Ordination of Priests each year at that time. Either the Bride or the Groom must be a practicing member of Sacred Heart Parish in order to request a wedding date.

**COMMUNION TO THE HOMEBOUND**

A Priest or Deacon will visit monthly. Extraordinary Ministers visit those who wish to receive more often. Always notify us about the homebound parishioners who wish to be visited.

**RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS**

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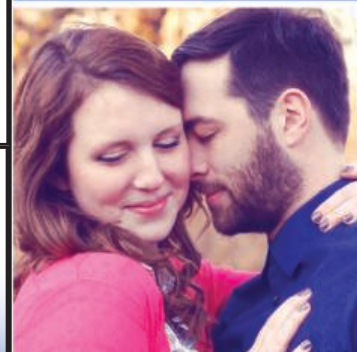
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
