


Psalm—"Lord, you will show us the path of life" (Ps 16:1-2, 5, 7-8, 9-10,11)

As a reminder, and to prevent: confusion or delay when the time nears for (and sacramental sacraments preparation), reception is not governed by: where one attends school nor by where you attend Mass nor receive Religious Education. For example, if you live in the: territorial boundaries of Sacred Heart of Jesus Parish, and your 2nd grader attends Good Shepherd School in Northampton, they will receive their Religious Education from Good Shepherd School, but receive the: sacrament of First Holy Communion at Sacred Heart of Jesus.





## KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS FOOD BANK DONATION UPDATE

Due to the generosity of our Sacred Heart parishioners, our Council of the Knights of Columbus delivered 227 pounds of non-perishable items to the Bath Area Food Bank Thursday April 6. ## SAINT FIDELIS OF SIGMARINGEN, PRIEST

Feast Day-Monday, April 24th

After receiving his doctorate in philosophy and law, Saint Fidelis tutored young boys from noble families. But his

heart was with those who were poor. He established himself as a lawyer and took only those cases that upheld the cause of those who were poor and oppressed. Inspired to search for a deeper, more committed life of serving God, Saint Fidelis decided to enter the Franciscans. He distributed his wealth among people in need and made religious vows. He was soon chosen as superior.

While Fidelis was guardian of the monastery, an epidemic broke out in the city, and Fidelis opened up the friary to care for those who were sick. He cured many soldiers staying there. In 1608, Protestantism swept through Switzerland, and because Fidelis was a good preacher, he was sent by the Propagation of the Faith to bring the Swiss people back to unity with the Church of Rome.

It was a dangerous mission. The people in revolt against the Catholic Church hated anyone connected with it. But Fidelis put his life in the hands of God. Outside the church he was surrounded by a crowd led by the preachers who offered to save his life if he would apostatize. Fidelis replied: "I came to extirpate heresy, not to embrace it", whereupon he was struck down by the angry crowd.

History has a way of making us realize that believing in our Lord sometimes has drastic consequences. Most of us have not experienced such harsh consequences but have allowed ourselves to be silenced by some people having negative views on God and faith. Our Lord wants us to have a voice. Remember, His words will never fail us and His words will last for eternity....

### **Pro-Life Corner**

Shortly after our "re-conversion" in our late 20's, my wife Freda and I were faced with the decision of having her sterilized because of a medical condition. She had lost the function of one of her kidneys during the pregnancy of our first child. Because of this, the OB-GYN suggested that she be sterilized to avoid any further complications from future pregnancies. Something inside of us, the Holy Spirit maybe, made us refuse this medical advice.

Years later, another doctor, OB-GYB, proclaimed; "Oh we used to think that getting pregnant diminished kidney function, we now know that it improves it." Our subsequent four children, and their subsequent 13 children certainly are happy we didn't listen to the first doctor and instead went by the promptings of the Holy Spirit and by the Catholic Catechism #2297 "Respect for Bodily integrity."

Given that Freda's medical circumstances may have morally justified sterilization at that time, (it would have been borderline), the fact that the medical opinion on the issue changed, was clearly a sign of God's blessing on her courage to continue to bear children. Her kidney function with only the one kidney is normal and healthy to this day.

### GODPARENT/SPONSOR ELIGIBILITY FORMS

In order to act as a godparent for Baptism or a Sponsor for Confirmation, one must be a Catholic in good standing. Specifically this means Mass attendance every Sunday (Exodus 20:8), striving to live the moral precepts of the Church, and if married, a valid marriage in the Catholic Church.

### THE SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

is celebrated on Sunday at Noon. If you are a parishioner and would like to schedule a Baptism, please contact the Parish Office. Prior to the baptism, parents must attend a Baptism Preparation Class which is designed to instruct the parents about the teachings of the church regarding Baptism, and to offer assistance in the spiritual preparation for their child's reception of the first of the Sacraments of the Church.

### **SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE**

Parishioners who are contemplating the Sacrament of Matrimony should contact the Pastor and mutually agree upon a date at least a year prior to the Wedding. The Church takes the preparation for the Sacrament of Matrimony very seriously, and requires completion of the Diocesan Marriage Preparation Program six months before the wedding. The normative time for weddings is Saturday between 10:00 AM and 1:30 PM. Weddings are not celebrated on major holidays, nor on the first weekend of June in deference to Ordination of Priests each year at that time. Either the Bride or the Groom must be a practicing member of Sacred Heart Parish in order to request a wedding date.

### COMMUNION TO THE HOMEBOUND

A Priest or Deacon will visit monthly. Extraordinary Ministers visit those who wish to receive more often. Always notify us about the homebound parishioners who wish to be visited.

### RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS
