



KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS FOOD BANK DONATION UPDATE

Due to the generosity of our Sacred Heart parishioners, our Council of the Knights of **Columbus delivered 306 pounds of non-perishable** items to the St Vincent DePaul Food Bank at St. Paul's Church, South Allentown on May 10. This is the 13th donation for the 2022-23 Fraternal Year, bringing the total year-to-date to 2,891 pounds. Our next donation will be made to the Bath Area Food Bank in mid-June. Supreme Council of the Knights of Columbus rebates \$100, up to \$500 annually, to local Councils for each 1,000 pounds of food delivered. This rebate is then passed on by our Council to the Food Banks; THANK YOU for your past donations. The need in our communities is still great with current economic conditions; please continue to support this worthwhile endeavor.

I AM THE GENTLE RAIN



PRO-LIFE CORNER

Seven parishioners and I were given a tour of the Cay-Galgon Life House, (This is where our "baby bottle donations go.") on Saturday, April 29th. I learned a number of things. Firstly, it is not a "pregnancy life center". In fact, it does not deal with abortion decisions directly at all. The women who are served and helped with their pregnancy needs have already made up their minds to have their babies.

The second and most important thing I learned was that this involves a lot of work! The center houses 6 women at whatever stage they are at in their pregnancy, that is their maximum space, and there is a waiting list. They also have an extensive ministry to many women who need help outside of housing. There were a whole room of bags filled with the many different needs of the mothers that was ready just for that week.

I would say their greatest need would be for the money it takes to staff the twelve full time workers. They seem to have a lot of stuff, diapers, wipes, etc. coming in from a lot of different places, Walmart and Amazon, for example. But it is a laborintensive ministry and cannot be done without the workers who staff the facility 24 hours a day, seven days a week. These workers are people who are serving total strangers in need, and need our support. -- Deacon Lewis Ferris

We welcome all who join us at our Mass. We encourage you to become an active participant in the life of our Parish. All Catholics who live within our Parish boundaries should register. Please call the Parish Office for more information.

SACRAMENT OF ANOINTING OF THE SICK

is given to those who are seriously ill and in danger of death. When there is danger of death, please call the Pastor anytime, day or night.

GODPARENT/SPONSOR ELIGIBILITY FORMS

In order to act as a godparent for Baptism or a Sponsor for Confirmation, one must be a Catholic in good standing. Specifically this means Mass attendance every Sunday (Exodus 20:8), striving to live the moral precepts of the Church, and if married, a valid marriage in the Catholic Church.

THE SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

is celebrated on Sunday at Noon. If you are a parishioner and would like to schedule a Baptism, please contact the Parish Office. Prior to the baptism, parents must attend a Baptism Preparation Class which is designed to instruct the parents about the teachings of the church regarding Baptism, and to offer assistance in the spiritual preparation for their child's reception of the first of the Sacraments of the Church.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

Parishioners who are contemplating the Sacrament of Matrimony should contact the Pastor and mutually agree upon a date at least a year prior to the Wedding. The Church takes the preparation for the Sacrament of Matrimony very seriously, and requires completion of the Diocesan Marriage Preparation Program six months before the wedding. The normative time for weddings is Saturday between 10:00 AM and 1:30 PM. Weddings are not celebrated on major holidays, nor on the first weekend of June in deference to Ordination of Priests each year at that time. Either the Bride or the Groom must be a practicing member of Sacred Heart Parish in order to request a wedding date.

COMMUNION TO THE HOMEBOUND

A Priest or Deacon will visit monthly. Extraordinary Ministers visit those who wish to receive more often. Always notify us about the homebound parishioners who wish to be visited.

RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS

Those who desire entrance into the Catholic Church are warmly welcome through the **<u>RCIA</u>**. Please contact the Pastor for more information.

Following the death of a relative or friend, offerings may be made to the Church in loving memory of the deceased. Offerings may specify a particular request or be placed in the Memorial Fund for parish needs.

VICTIM ASSISTANCE COORDINATOR

The Diocese of Allentown provides assistance to anyone who, as a minor, was sexually abused by a priest, deacon, or employee/volunteer of the Diocese/Parish. Parents, guardians, children, and survivors of sexual abuse are invited and encouraged to contact the Diocese of Allentown for more information about this program. The fullness of compassion should be extended to these victims by the Church.
