





In the first book, Theophilus, I dealt with all that Jesus did and taught until the day he was taken up, after giving instructions through the Holy Spirit to the apostles whom he had chosen. He presented himself alive to them by many proofs after he had suffered, appearing to them during forty days and speaking about the kingdom of God. (Acts 1:1-3)

When they had gathered together they asked him, "Lord, are you at this time going to restore the kingdom to Israel?" He answered them, "It is not for you to know the times or seasons that the Father has established by his own authority. But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes upon you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, throughout Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." When he had said this, as they were looking on, he was lifted up, and a cloud took him from their sight. While they were looking intently at the sky as he was going, suddenly two men dressed in white garments stood beside them. They said, "Men of Galilee, why are you standing there looking at the sky? This Jesus who has been taken up from you into heaven will return in the same way as you have seen him going into heaven." Then they returned to Jerusalem from the mount called Olivet, which is near Jerusalem, a Sabbath day's journey away. (Acts 1:6-12)

The disciples were able to see Jesus before he went to his Father. Just think how Jesus felt knowing he was going to be reunited with his beloved Father, like us when we see a loved one and knowing we will be embraced by their love and warmth, but greater. Jesus wants us to have the experience of going to his Father as he did and wants us to receive that loving embrace from Our Lord. This is why Jesus walked the earth to pave the way home to his Father for us. The way we accomplish this is believing in his Holy Book, follow his teachings and to open our hearts and souls to God (our Father). Jesus has no problem sharing his Father with all of us. Take advantage of the offer to become a part of this Blessed and Holy family. No one who believes in our Father and asks to be included into this family will be turned away.





PRO-LIFE CORNER

A 2011 sample mail survey published in PubMed Central, sent out to 1,800 OB-GYN's showed the following: 97% of them encountered patients seeking abortions, while only 14% actually performed abortions. (Note: An abortion is a procedure all of these physicians are capable of performing.) That means that 86% of these doctors, did not take care of the patients request. I cannot think of another medical situation where that would occur.

Of course, the reason would be that being pregnant is not a disease. It is one of the most normal conditions that exist, and most physicians are in the "business" of saving lives and improving their patient's quality of life. The survey also showed that the more religious the doctor was, the less likely they were to do an abortion.

Unfortunately, many of the 84% said they would refer these patients to the 14%ers, but even so it is a testament to the fact that the main group of people (OB-GYN's) who know more about babies and pregnancies than any other group of people, will not take part in performing this simple procedure even though it would be a lucrative addition to their practice, and not exceptionally difficult to perform.

SACRAMENT OF ANOINTING OF THE SICK

is given to those who are seriously ill and in danger of death. When there is danger of death, please call the Pastor anytime, day or night.

GODPARENT/SPONSOR ELIGIBILITY FORMS

In order to act as a godparent for Baptism or a Sponsor for Confirmation, one must be a Catholic in good standing. Specifically this means Mass attendance every Sunday (Exodus 20:8), striving to live the moral precepts of the Church, and if married, a valid marriage in the Catholic Church.

THE SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

is celebrated on Sunday at Noon. If you are a parishioner and would like to schedule a Baptism, please contact the Parish Office. Prior to the baptism, parents must attend a Baptism Preparation Class which is designed to instruct the parents about the teachings of the church regarding Baptism, and to offer assistance in the spiritual preparation for their child's reception of the first of the Sacraments of the Church.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

Parishioners who are contemplating the Sacrament of Matrimony should contact the Pastor and mutually agree upon a date at least a year prior to the Wedding. The Church takes the preparation for the Sacrament of Matrimony very seriously, and requires completion of the Diocesan Marriage Preparation Program six months before the wedding. The normative time for weddings is Saturday between 10:00 AM and 1:30 PM. Weddings are not celebrated on major holidays, nor on the first weekend of June in deference to Ordination of Priests each year at that time. Either the Bride or the Groom must be a practicing member of Sacred Heart Parish in order to request a wedding date.

COMMUNION TO THE HOMEBOUND

A Priest or Deacon will visit monthly. Extraordinary Ministers visit those who wish to receive more often. Always notify us about the homebound parishioners who wish to be visited.

RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS

Those who desire entrance into the Catholic Church are warmly welcome through the **RCIA**. Please contact the Pastor for more information.

CONSOLATION MINISTRY
