

THE MOST HOLY BODY AND BLOOD OF CHRIST JUNE 11TH

First Reading— Moses said to the people: "Remember how for forty years now the LORD, your God, has directed all your journeying in the desert, so as to test you by affliction and find out whether or not it was your intention to keep his commandments. He therefore let you be afflicted with hunger, and then fed you with manna, a food unknown to you and your fathers, in order to show you that not by bread alone does one live, but by every word that comes forth from the mouth of the LORD. (*Dt 8:2-3, 14b-16a*)

<u>Psalm</u>- "Praise the Lord, Jerusalem." (Ps 147:12-13, 14-15, 19-20)

Second Reading—Brothers and sisters: The cup of blessing that we bless, is it not a participation in the blood of Christ? The bread that we break, is it not a participation in the body of Christ? Because the loaf of bread is one, we, though many, are one body, for we all partake of the one loaf. (*I* Cor 10:16-17)

Gospel—Jesus said to the Jewish crowds: "I am the living bread that come down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world." The Jews quarreled among themselves, saying, "How can this man give us his flesh to eat?" 

THE MOST SACRED HEART OF JESUS FRIDAY, JUNE 16TH, 2023

Celebrated on the third Friday after Pentecost, the devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus recognizes Jesus' great love for us as symbolized by His heart. The devotion began in the 1670s, when Jesus appeared multiple times to St. Margaret Mary Alacoque, a Visitation nun in France. Through these visions, He told her how He wished to be honored with the symbol of His heart, asking for the faithful to make amends for any wrongdoing they had done, frequently take Communion, and observe the Holy Hour. In 1856, the devotion was added to the church calendar by Pope Pius IX.

Pope Pius XII explained that the devotion to the Sacred Heart is connected to our worship of Christ as God incarnate:

It is altogether impossible to enumerate the heavenly gifts which devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus has poured out on the souls of the faithful, purifying them, offering them heavenly strength, rousing them to the attainment of all virtues. Therefore, recalling those wise words of the Apostle St. James, "Every best gift and every perfect gift is from above, coming down from the Father of Lights...

That all may understand more exactly the teachings which the selected texts of the Old and New Testament furnish concerning this devotion, they must clearly understand the reasons why the Church gives the highest form of worship to the Heart of the divine Redeemer ... The first, which applies also to the other sacred members of the Body of Jesus Christ, rests on that principle whereby we recognize that His Heart, the noblest part of human nature, is hypostatically united to the Person of the divine Word. Consequently, there must be paid to it that worship of adoration with which the Church honors the Person of the Incarnate Son of God Himself. We are dealing here with an article of faith, for it has been solemnly defined in the general Council of Ephesus and the second Council of Constantinople.

Secondly, Pope Pius XII shared how the devotion is related to Christ's love for the human race:

The other reason...arises from the fact that His Heart, more than all the other members of His body, is the natural sign and symbol of His boundless love for the human race. "There is in the Sacred Heart," as Our predecessor of immortal memory, Leo XIII, pointed out, "the symbol and express image of the infinite love of Jesus Christ which moves us to love in return."

Significance of the Devotion

Jesus's profound love for us is demonstrated through His willingness to sacrifice His life for our sake. The love from His heart motivated all His actions — His inner life manifested in His demonstrated virtues and sacrifice. Yet this great love is • often received with ingratitude, even by the faithful. The purpose of devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus is to focus our hearts on receiving and returning His love with gratitude — with all of our heart, soul, and strength — that He may be glorified. What better way to be a part of Jesus's heart is through receiving the Holy Eucharist.

Prayer of the Sacred Heart of Jesus

Merciful Jesus, I consecrate myself today and always to Your Most Sacred Heart, Most Sacred Heart of Jesus, I implore, that I may ever love You, more and more, Most Sacred Heart of Jesus, I trust in You! Most Sacred Heart of Jesus, have mercy on us! Most Sacred Heart of Jesus, I believe in Your love for me, Jesus, meek and humble of heart, make my heart like Your heart. Amen





<u>THE MOST HOLY</u> BODY AND BLOOD OF CHRIST (CORPUS CHRISTI) Sunday, June 11

The Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ is also known as the Solemnity of Corpus Christi, which

translates from Latin to "Body of Christ." This feast originated in France in the mid-thirteenth century and was extended to the whole Church by Pope Urban IV in 1264. This feast is celebrated on the Thursday following the Trinity Sunday or, as in the USA, on the Sunday following that feast.

This feast calls us to focus on two manifestations of the Body of Christ, the Holy Eucharist and the Church. The primary purpose of this feast is to focus our attention on the Eucharist.

At every Mass our attention is called to the Eucharist and the Real Presence of Christ in it. The secondary focus of this feast is upon the Body of Christ as it is present in the Church. The Church is called the Body of Christ because of the intimate communion which Jesus shares with his disciples. He expresses this in the gospels by using the metaphor of a body in which He is the head. This image helps keep in focus both the unity and the diversity of the Church.

The Feast of Corpus Christi is commonly used as an opportunity for public Eucharistic processions, which serves as a sign of common faith and adoration. Our worship of Jesus in His Body and Blood calls us to offer to God our Father a pledge of undivided love and an offering of ourselves to the service of others.

When saying Amen after receiving the body of Christ we are acknowledging that we are excepting a true part of Jesus. He is allowing Himself to be one with us and us with Him. Jesus wants us to commit our heart and soul to God and He did this by dying for us and offering Himself in body and blood. Think about it, we celebrate the feast day of the (*Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ*) and then we celebrate the (*Most Sacred Heart of Jesus*).

What more of Himself can Jesus offer us?

<u>Do not take the Eucharist lightly,</u> <u>always remember what it is!</u>

A recent article said that Planned Parenthood, (or better yet, "Planned barren-hood", or 'Banned parenthood") are reallocating their funds, (and they have a lot of funds, mostly received from the government!) They are doing so in response to the reversal of Roe vs. Wade. They receive \$553.7 million dollars from the government. Those are our tax dollars!

Because of the Hyde Amendment, Planned Parenthood cannot use the federal grants and monies to pay for abortions. However, they are the biggest abortion providers in the country, and without the federal funds, which is 43% of their income, where would they get the money to keep their employees paid, pay their utilities etc. So, saying the tax dollars are not being used to pay directly for abortions is non-sense. It all depends on where they list expenses on their accounting sheets.

Keep in mind that Planned Parenthood was founded by Margaret Sanger in 1921. Her stated purpose was to eliminate what she called the "inferior races" through abortion and artificial contraception. Their clinics are still mostly located in inner cities.

GODPARENT/SPONSOR ELIGIBILITY FORMS

In order to act as a godparent for Baptism or a Sponsor for Confirmation, one must be a Catholic in good standing. Specifically this means Mass attendance every Sunday (Exodus 20:8), striving to live the moral precepts of the Church, and if married, a valid marriage in the Catholic Church.

THE SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

is celebrated on Sunday at Noon. If you are a parishioner and would like to schedule a Baptism, please contact the Parish Office. Prior to the baptism, parents must attend a Baptism Preparation Class which is designed to instruct the parents about the teachings of the church regarding Baptism, and to offer assistance in the spiritual preparation for their child's reception of the first of the Sacraments of the Church.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

June 11, 2023

Parishioners who are contemplating the Sacrament of Matrimony should contact the Pastor and mutually agree upon a date at least a year prior to the Wedding. The Church takes the preparation for the Sacrament of Matrimony very seriously, and requires completion of the Diocesan Marriage Preparation Program six months before the wedding. The normative time for weddings is Saturday between 10:00 AM and 1:30 PM. Weddings are not celebrated on major holidays, nor on the first weekend of June in deference to Ordination of Priests each year at that time. Either the Bride or the Groom must be a practicing member of Sacred Heart Parish in order to request a wedding date.

COMMUNION TO THE HOMEBOUND

A Priest or Deacon will visit monthly. Extraordinary Ministers visit those who wish to receive more often. Always notify us about the homebound parishioners who wish to be visited.
