





# THE MOST HOLY TRINITY Sunday, June 11

The doctrine of the Holy Trinity teaches that there is only one God in all existence who has revealed himself as three distinct Persons: the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit; three Persons of the one nature and being. These three Persons are co-equal and co-eternal.

The biblical foundations of the Trinity are that the Bible teaches there is only one God, calls the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit God, teaches that they are three distinct Persons, and teaches that these three Persons share significant divine attributes. We also see from the Bible that they work together perfectly, are grouped together and given equal importance in key passages, as well as put on an equal level with one another. All this forces us to view God in a Trinitarian way. While there is subordination within the Trinity, this is simply because God is a God of order and a community of love, and does not make the Son or the Spirit less divine than the Father.

We can't understand everything about God, but we can still know him personally for salvation, and everything that we need to know about him has been revealed in the Bible. The Holy Trinity is a biblical teaching that is essential to the Christian faith; we must believe in it in order to truly know God and have eternal life.

There is a legend about Saint Patrick using a shamrock to help him explain the concept of the Holy Trinity to unbelievers by showing them the three separate leaves of the shamrock which are the Father, Son and Holy Spirit but the 3 leaves connect to one base stem (GOD). He used this as an example of three persons in one God. Next time you see a 3 leaf clover look at it closely and see it as Saint Patrick did.

# **PRO-LIFE CORNER**

The "Catholic Medical Association" has expressed their deep concern over the possibility of the FDA making Birth Control pills available over the counter. These are not benign drugs. Medical journals such as Lancet and the American Journal of Psychiatry report that the birth control pills result in an increased risk for breast cancer, brain tumor, HIV transmission and suicide. Also, the World Health Organization classifies oral contraceptives as a class one carcinogen. These are pretty significant side effects especially since they are not treating a disease.

The press release continues: "If fully approved, the social impact of that decision would be dramatic. More women, especially adolescents and young adults, will develop these adverse effects." Needless to say, the CMA has a very strong recommendation against such approval.




Some of the books are well used so please maintain the book(s) with care. If you don't see something you like, please feel free to come back again.

# **GODPARENT/SPONSOR ELIGIBILITY FORMS**

In order to act as a godparent for Baptism or a Sponsor for Confirmation, one must be a Catholic in good standing. Specifically this means Mass attendance every Sunday (Exodus 20:8), striving to live the moral precepts of the Church, and if married, a valid marriage in the Catholic Church.

# THE SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

is celebrated on Sunday at Noon. If you are a parishioner and would like to schedule a Baptism, please contact the Parish Office. Prior to the baptism, parents must attend a Baptism Preparation Class which is designed to instruct the parents about the teachings of the church regarding Baptism, and to offer assistance in the spiritual preparation for their child's reception of the first of the Sacraments of the Church.

# SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

Parishioners who are contemplating the Sacrament of Matrimony should contact the Pastor and mutually agree upon a date at least a year prior to the Wedding. The Church takes the preparation for the Sacrament of Matrimony very seriously, and requires completion of the Diocesan Marriage Preparation Program six months before the wedding. The normative time for weddings is Saturday between 10:00 AM and 1:30 PM. Weddings are not celebrated on major holidays, nor on the first weekend of June in deference to Ordination of Priests each year at that time. Either the Bride or the Groom must be a practicing member of Sacred Heart Parish in order to request a wedding date.

### **COMMUNION TO THE HOMEBOUND**

A Priest or Deacon will visit monthly. Extraordinary Ministers visit those who wish to receive more often. Always notify us about the homebound parishioners who wish to be visited.
