#### 24th SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME September 17th

**First Reading**—Wrath and anger are hateful things, yet the sinner hugs them tight. The vengeful will suffer the LORD's vengeance, for he remembers their sins in detail. Forgive your neighbor's injustice; then when you pray, your own sins will be forgiven. Could anyone nourish anger against another and expect healing from the LORD? Could anyone refuse mercy to another like himself, can he seek pardon for his own sins? If one who is but flesh cherishes wrath, who will forgive his sins? Remember your last days, set enmity aside; remember death and decay, and cease from sin! Think of the commandments, hate not your neighbor; remember the Most High's covenant, and overlook faults. *(Sir 27:30-28:7)* 

<u>Psalm</u>-"The Lord is kind and merciful, slow to anger, and rich in compassion." (*Ps 103:1-2, 3-4, 9-10, 11-12*)

**Second Reading**—Brothers and sisters: None of us lives for oneself, and no one dies for oneself. For if we live, we live for the Lord, and if we die, we die for the Lord; so then, whether we live or die, we are the Lord's. For this is why Christ died and came to life, that he might be Lord of both the dead and the living. (*Rom 14:7-9*)

Gospel—Peter approached Jesus and asked him, "Lord, if my brother sins against me, how often must I forgive? As many as seven times?" Jesus answered, "I say to you, not seven times but seventy-seven times. That is why the kingdom of heaven may be likened to a king who decided to settle accounts with his servants. When he began the accounting, a debtor was brought before him who owed him a huge amount. Since he had no way of paying it back, his master ordered him to be sold, along with his wife, his children, and all his property, in payment of the debt. At that, the servant fell down, did him homage, and said, 'Be patient with me, and I will pay you back in full.' Moved with compassion the master of that servant let him go and forgave him the loan. When that servant had left, he found one of his fellow servants who owed him a much smaller amount. He seized him and started to choke him, demanding, 'Pay back what you owe.' Falling to his knees, his fellow servant begged him, 'Be patient with me, and I will pay you back.' But he refused. Instead, he had the fellow servant put in prison until he paid back the debt. (Mt 18:21-35)



## SAINT MATTHEW, APOSTLE Feast Day—September 21

Jesus heals the paralytic in Capernaum, and he remains in the area of Capernaum by the Sea of Galilee. Again crowds come to him, and he begins teaching them. As

he walks on, he sees Matthew, who is also called Levi, sitting at the customs post. Jesus extends a wonderful invitation to him: "Follow me." Matthew got up and followed Jesus. Matthew responds immediately. Hence, Matthew leaves his responsibilities as a tax collector behind and becomes a disciple of Jesus.

Matthew holds a large feast at his house. Who are invited in addition to Jesus and his disciples? Well, a number of Matthew's former associates, other tax collectors, are present. They collect taxes for the hated Roman authorities, including taxes on ships coming into the harbor, taxes on caravan traffic on the main roads, and duties on imported goods. How do the Jews in general view those tax collectors? The people despise them because they often dishonestly exact more money than the regular tax rate. There are also 'sinners' at the feast, individuals who have a reputation for practicing wrongdoing.

The Pharisees do not understand that these are the people Jesus wants to follow him. Observing Jesus at the feast with such people, the self-righteous Pharisees who are present ask his disciples: "Why does your teacher eat with tax collectors and sinners?" He heard this and said. "Those who are well do not need a physician, but the sick do. Go and learn the meaning of the words, 'I desire mercy, and not sacrifice.' I did not come to call the righteous people, but sinners."

How often in our busy lives do we give up something for God? When we have a chance to drop what we are doing and follow Jesus, Do We? For example, do we put God first, do we defend the words of our Lord, do we put someone else's needs first before our own, do we forgive and ask for forgiveness? Read the gospel of Saint Matthew and follow along with him as he walked side by side with Jesus and experience what he did.

Prior to the baptism, parents must attend a Baptism Preparation Class which is designed to instruct the parents about the teachings of the church regarding Baptism, and to offer assistance in the spiritual preparation for their child's reception of the first of the Sacraments of the Church. **SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE** 

Parishioners who are contemplating the Sacrament of Matrimony should contact the Pastor and mutually agree upon a date at least a year prior to the Wedding. The Church takes the preparation for the Sacrament of Matrimony very seriously, and requires completion of the Diocesan Marriage Preparation Program six months before the wedding. The normative time for weddings is Saturday between 10:00 AM and 1:30 PM. Weddings are not celebrated on major holidays, nor on the first weekend of June in deference to Ordination of Priests each year at that time. Either the Bride or the Groom must be a practicing member of Sacred Heart Parish in order to request a wedding date.
