

28th SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME October 15th

First Reading—On this mountain the LORD of hosts will provide for all peoples a feast of rich food and choice wines, juicy, rich food and pure, choice wines. On this mountain he will destroy the veil that veils all peoples, the web that is woven over all nations; he will destroy death forever. The Lord GOD will wipe away the tears from every face; the reproach of his people he will remove from the whole earth; for the LORD has spoken. On that day it will be said: "Behold our God, to whom we looked to save us! This is the LORD for whom we looked; let us rejoice and be glad that he has saved us!" For the hand of the LORD will rest on this mountain. (Is 25:6-10a)

<u>Psalm</u>-"I shall live in the house of the Lord all the days of my life." (Ps 23:1-3a, 3b-4, 5, 6)

Second Reading—Brothers and sisters: I know how to live in humble circumstances; I know also how to live with abundance. In every circumstance and in all things I have learned the secret of being well fed and of going hungry, of living in abundance and of being in need. I can do all things in him who strengthens me. Still, it was kind of you to share in my distress. My God will fully supply whatever you need, in accord with his glorious riches in Christ Jesus. To our God and Father, glory forever and ever. Amen.

Gospel—Jesus again in reply spoke to the chief priests and elders of the people in parables, saying, "The kingdom of heaven may be likened to a king who gave a wedding feast for his son. He dispatched his servants to summon the invited guests to the feast, but they refused to come. A second time he sent other servants, saying, "Tell those invited: "Behold, I have prepared my banquet, my calves and fattened cattle are killed, and everything is ready; come to the feast."' Some ignored the invitation and went away, one to his farm, another to his business. The rest laid hold of his servants. mistreated them, and killed them. The king was enraged and sent his troops, destroyed those murderers, and burned their city. Then he said to his servants, 'The feast is ready, but those who were invited were not worthy to come. Go out, therefore, into the main roads and invite to the feast whomever you find.' 


ONLINE MASS WITH FATHER BUTERA



KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS BABY BOTTLE DRIVE OCTOBER 7TH THRU OCTOBER 29TH



Sacred Heart Church and the Knights of Columbus are again sponsoring a baby bottle drive during the month of OCTOBER to support the Cay Galgon Center (formerly known as Mary's Shelter) in Bethlehem. Sacred Heart parish has been a major contributor to the Center for the past 10 years. The purpose of the shelter is to provide temporary housing to pregnant women who chose LIFE for their babies despite facing challenges such as lack of financial or family support. In addition, the shelter provides pre-natal health and parenting classes, job training, continuing education, and general life-skills guidance.

If you didn't get your bottle last weekend, it's not too late! Bottles are available in the ramp entrance of the church and will be collected on the weekend of October 28th and October 29th.

The Center will need increased financial support since Governor Shapiro has <u>cut all funding</u> to the REAL ALTERNATIVES program in next year's budget which supports centers such as Gay Galgon.

Parishioners are asked to fill the bottles with spare coins, cash, or tax-deductible checks (made out to-Cay Galgon Life House). Your generous support is greatly needed and deeply appreciated.

PRO-LIFE CORNER

Where have all of the Frenchmen gone? Pope Francis recently made a visit to France and met with their Catholic leader. France is in the process of proposing legislature that would legalize euthanasia throughout the country. Interestingly enough, they postponed the legislation during the Pope's visit. I wonder why? Our Pope, who speaks very directly on many issues, when asked by reporters what he thought about this, answered "You don't play with life."

He said there is a sense of "false compassion" that seems to believe that all pain must be avoided at all costs. He has also called euthanasia a "sin against God." He recommended one of our, (my wife and I) favorite books, written in 1907, by Father Robert Hugh Benson, "Lord of the World." It is a short Science Fiction novel and a very easy read; get a copy; you'll enjoy it!

GOD'S INTERVENTION



Divine intervention is, simply put, God intervening in the affairs of the world. Divine intervention can be God causing something to happen or God preventing something from happening. Atheists, agnostics, and deists can

find alternate explanations for even the most clearly miraculous events. Some believers see examples of divine intervention everywhere, interpreting seemingly random unexplained events as clear instruction from God to go one direction instead of another. So, does God intervene in the affairs of the world? If so, are there any undeniable examples of this divine intervention? Has God left any fingerprints on His handiwork? The answer to that is Yes!

You can read about God's interventions in the Old and New Testament in the bible. From parting the Red Sea, Noah, Moses, the birth of Jesus and many more. The pages are filled with God's intervention and He still intervenes in our lives today.

For us it starts with our prayers. It can be small like helping us cope with a difficult person. Praying for an answer to a question of (Why?). Asking for healing for someone who is suffering physically or mentally. Praying for someone who has fallen spiritually and the need to forgive.

Could the answers or intervention be:

- † Knowing and accepting the change has to come from you to change how you cope with difficulty people.
- † The answer to the question (Why?), is coming to you from an unexpected person with open arms.
- † People who are put in your path like doctors, nurses and staff to help with physical and mental healing or talking to someone who believes in God to help with spiritual guidance.
- † Hearing someone or yourself saying "I am so Sorry" and truly understanding what those words mean.

Prayer is the start of finding the answers from Our Lord and by listening to him, He is then intervening in our lives. God our father will never turn away from anyone who believes in Him. Reach out and trust in Him...



KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS FOOD BANK DONATION UPDATE

SACRAMENT OF ANOINTING OF THE SICK

is given to those who are seriously ill and in danger of death. When there is danger of death, please call the Pastor anytime, day or night.

GODPARENT/SPONSOR ELIGIBILITY FORMS

In order to act as a godparent for Baptism or a Sponsor for Confirmation, one must be a Catholic in good standing. Specifically this means Mass attendance every Sunday (Exodus 20:8), striving to live the moral precepts of the Church, and if married, a valid marriage in the Catholic Church.

THE SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

is celebrated on Sunday at Noon. If you are a parishioner and would like to schedule a Baptism, please contact the Parish Office. Prior to the baptism, parents must attend a Baptism Preparation Class which is designed to instruct the parents about the teachings of the church regarding Baptism, and to offer assistance in the spiritual preparation for their child's reception of the first of the Sacraments of the Church.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

Parishioners who are contemplating the Sacrament of Matrimony should contact the Pastor and mutually agree upon a date at least a year prior to the Wedding. The Church takes the preparation for the Sacrament of Matrimony very seriously, and requires completion of the Diocesan Marriage Preparation Program six months before the wedding. The normative time for weddings is Saturday between 10:00 AM and 1:30 PM. Weddings are not celebrated on major holidays, nor on the first weekend of June in deference to Ordination of Priests each year at that time. Either the Bride or the Groom must be a practicing member of Sacred Heart Parish in order to request a wedding date.

COMMUNION TO THE HOMEBOUND

A Priest or Deacon will visit monthly. Extraordinary Ministers visit those who wish to receive more often. Always notify us about the homebound parishioners who wish to be visited.

RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS


