First Reading—A great King am I, says the LORD of hosts, and my name will be feared among the nations. And now, O priests, this commandment is for you: If you do not listen, if you do not lay it to heart, to give glory to my name, says the LORD of hosts, I will send a curse upon you and of your blessing I will make a curse. You have turned aside from the way, and have caused many to falter by your instruction; you have made void the covenant of Levi, says the LORD of hosts. (Mal 1:14b-2:2b, 8-10)

Second Reading—Brothers and sisters: We were gentle among you, as a nursing mother cares for her children. 


FORTY HOURS DEVOTIONS



FATHER WALTER JENKINS, HOMILIST FOR FORTY HOURS

Born and raised in Binghamton, NY Father Jenkins was given a strong emphasis on faith through his enrollment in Catholic schools. Later in life he earned his BA in Government from King's College. During his time at King's College he first met the with Holy Cross priests and brothers who ministered at the college. "I met a group that was deeply dedicated to educating young people in a context of faith. Given my family upbringing in Catholic schools it was natural that I would be attracted to my religious community and their focus on Catholic education," said Father Jenkins. Once graduating in 1988, he started his service with the Congregation of Holy Cross as a Seminarian at Notre Dame. He would later receive his Master of Divinity at the University of Notre Dame and his EdD in Catholic School Leadership at the University of San Francisco.

Through his service with the Congregation of Holy Cross Father Jenkins values collaboration between who they minister. "From our founding we've valued the lived experience of those around us, their faith, joys, and sorrows. Placing God at the center of everything allows us to be successful, joyful, and hopeful," said Father Jenkins. Using these values, Father Jenkins

has held several positions within Catholic Education. Some notable positions that he held include Residence Director & Director of Campus Ministry at Stonehill College, Principal at Saint Patrick's Academy in Binghamton, NY, Principal at Bishop Hoban High School in Wilkes-Barre, NY, Religious Superior at King's College, and President at Holy Cross High School in Queens, NY.

Father Jenkins currently serves as the President of the Catholic Academy of Sussex County, in Sparta, New Jersey and directs three schools, Reverend Brown Memorial School, Pope John XXIII Middle School and Pope John XXIII High School.

VETERANS DAY

<u>VETERANS DAY—November 11,2023</u> <u>NEVER FORGET THE HEROES</u>

Military: Our soldiers should never be forgotten for their bravery and courage. If not for them, America would be a far different country than it is today. We need to honor all veterans plus the forgotten heroes on Veterans Day, also remembering them all the days in-between. These men and women risked their lives and many lost their future lives for our freedoms. We owe our troops a debt of gratitude for their valiant spirit in protecting all of us here in the USA and around the world.

Priest and clergy: How many priests were killed in the World Wars is still an open question, but they number in the thousands. Many clergy were required to serve in war alongside their fellow serviceman. During World Wars I and II, thousands of priests and other clergymen around the world ministered to the wounded and dying in Asia and in Europe, regardless of the side on which the combatants fought. Still today our clergy are there for all military personnel, no matter what their faith.

Medical: Military doctors, nurses and first responders who risked their lives to save others. These men and women walked into dangerous war environments to supply the troops and civilians with medical supplies and to preform life threating procedures. They committed themselves to save the lives and limbs of the brave soldiers and civilians who came to them from devastating situations.

Canine: The German Shepherd, Dutch Shepherd, and Belgian Malinois were dogs used in war times pulling carts with supplies, food and delivering messages. It is reported that, as of 2011 at least 600 U.S. military dogs were actively participating in the conflicts in Iraq and Afghanistan, including a Belgian Malinois who stood with the Navy Seals in the raid of Osama bin Laden's compound. It is said that "no breed of mammal is so diverse as the one that has gained the title of man's best friend."

Say a prayer for all the veterans and unsung heroes who returned home and for the faithful who did not. Remember that America was build on faith in Our Lord and pray for all serviceman and women past and present. Thank you and God bless all who serve!!!

PRO-LIFE CORNER

October is "Respect Life Month." Bishop Schlert sent out an email to all of the clergy, Priests and Deacons in the Diocese to preach on this subject. I preached about this topic on October 15th at the 7AM and 9AM Masses. For those of you who were not at these Masses, or those of you who were not listening, (I know who you are), here is a synopsis:

The issues of abortion and euthanasia are the primary issues facing the Church. Other matters may be important but nothing is more important than the "taking of innocent human life," which is the definition of murder in the Catholic Catechism. 



SACRAMENT OF ANOINTING OF THE SICK

is given to those who are seriously ill and in danger of death. When there is danger of death, please call the Pastor anytime, day or night.

GODPARENT/SPONSOR ELIGIBILITY FORMS

In order to act as a godparent for Baptism or a Sponsor for Confirmation, one must be a Catholic in good standing. Specifically this means Mass attendance every Sunday (Exodus 20:8), striving to live the moral precepts of the Church, and if married, a valid marriage in the Catholic Church.

THE SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

is celebrated on Sunday at Noon. If you are a parishioner and would like to schedule a Baptism, please contact the Parish Office. Prior to the baptism, parents must attend a Baptism Preparation Class which is designed to instruct the parents about the teachings of the church regarding Baptism, and to offer assistance in the spiritual preparation for their child's reception of the first of the Sacraments of the Church.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

Parishioners who are contemplating the Sacrament of Matrimony should contact the Pastor and mutually agree upon a date at least a year prior to the Wedding. The Church takes the preparation for the Sacrament of Matrimony very seriously, and requires completion of the Diocesan Marriage Preparation Program six months before the wedding. The normative time for weddings is Saturday between 10:00 AM and 1:30 PM. Weddings are not celebrated on major holidays, nor on the first weekend of June in deference to Ordination of Priests each year at that time. Either the Bride or the Groom must be a practicing member of Sacred Heart Parish in order to request a wedding date.

COMMUNION TO THE HOMEBOUND

A Priest or Deacon will visit monthly. Extraordinary Ministers visit those who wish to receive more often. Always notify us about the homebound parishioners who wish to be visited.

RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS
