





SAINT MARIANNE COPE, VIRGIN Feast Day—January 23rd

Saint Marianne Cope was a Germanborn American nun who dedicated her life to serving the sick and vulnerable. She is known for her work in Hawaii, where she spent the latter part of her life caring for patients with leprosy. Saint Marianne Cope was born on January 23rd, 1838,

in Heppenheim, Germany. Her family emigrated to the United States when she was a young girl, settling in Utica, New York. She entered the Sisters of Saint Francis religious order at the age of 24 and was given the name, Marianne.

In 1870, Sister Marianne was appointed the superior of Saint Joseph's Hospital in Syracuse, New York. She was known for her compassionate care of patients and for her innovations in healthcare, such as the establishment of the first hospital-based school of nursing in the United States.

In 1883, Sister Marianne was asked to lead a group of nuns to Hawaii to care for patients with leprosy, a disease that was then incurable and highly stigmatized. She spent the next 35 years on the island of Molokai, where she established a hospital and cared for patients with leprosy with great love and dignity.

Sister Marianne's work in Hawaii earned her widespread admiration and respect. She was known for her gentle and compassionate approach to caring for patients with leprosy, whom she saw not as outcasts but as beloved children of God. She was also known for her courage and determination, often traveling great distances on foot to visit patients in remote areas of the island.

She died in 1918 and was beatified on May 14, 2005 and canonized on October 21, 2012, both by Pope Benedict XVI.

GODPARENT/SPONSOR ELIGIBILITY FORMS

In order to act as a godparent for Baptism or a Sponsor for Confirmation, one must be a Catholic in good standing. Specifically this means Mass attendance every Sunday (Exodus 20:8), striving to live the moral precepts of the Church, and if married, a valid marriage in the Catholic Church.

THE SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

is celebrated on Sunday at Noon. If you are a parishioner and would like to schedule a Baptism, please contact the Parish Office. Prior to the baptism, parents must attend a Baptism Preparation Class which is designed to instruct the parents about the teachings of the church regarding Baptism, and to offer assistance in the spiritual preparation for their child's reception of the first of the Sacraments of the Church.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

Parishioners who are contemplating the Sacrament of Matrimony should contact the Pastor and mutually agree upon a date at least a year prior to the Wedding. The Church takes the preparation for the Sacrament of Matrimony very seriously, and requires completion of the Diocesan Marriage Preparation Program six months before the wedding. The normative time for weddings is Saturday between 10:00 AM and 1:30 PM. Weddings are not celebrated on major holidays, nor on the first weekend of June in deference to Ordination of Priests each year at that time. Either the Bride or the Groom must be a practicing member of Sacred Heart Parish in order to request a wedding date.

COMMUNION TO THE HOMEBOUND

A Priest or Deacon will visit monthly. Extraordinary Ministers visit those who wish to receive more often. Always notify us about the homebound parishioners who wish to be visited.
