SAINT JOSEPH, SPOUSE OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY—Feast Day March 19th

Beloved Father: Joseph placed himself at the service of God's plan of salvation. He cared for the Holy Family that God had entrusted to him. He became an attentive servant from the moment

of the Annunciation, a provident servant in caring for Mary and the Child she carried in her womb. He defended the Family in the moment of danger. Tender and loving father Joseph taught Jesus how to walk, holding Him by the hand. Jesus saw the tenderness of God in Joseph, the Just Man. In Joseph, Jesus saw a man of faith who knew how to view life with hope because, in the midst of the storm, God remains steadfast at the helm of the course of life.

Obedient Father: God's plan was revealed to Joseph through dreams. He always responded promptly: at the moment of the Annunciation of the Lord and when Herod wanted to kill the Child. Joseph was guided by God and he obeyed. Jesus witnessed and learned submission and obedience to God from Joseph and Mary.

Accepting Father: Joseph is presented as someone who is respectful and sensitive, capable of placing Mary's dignity and life above everything else, even above his own reputation. Joseph accepts, certain that everything is guided by God's providence. He understood that life reveals itself according to the degree to which God's plan is accepted, to the degree to which we reconcile ourselves to God's plan.

Working Father: Work, understood as participating in God's own work, is what Joseph carried out in his own life and what he taught Jesus. Work is important to bring to birth a new "normal", in which no one is excluded. St. Joseph's work recalls that Jesus, the Son of God-made-Man did not disdain manual labor and the importance of how work contributes to the world around Him.

Father in the Shadows: As a father, Joseph introduced the Son of God to life's experiences and realities: not holding Him back, not confining Him, not possessing Him, but fostering His capacity of making choices, His freedom, eventually letting Him leave home. The logic of love is always the logic of freedom: Joseph's joy is the gift of himself. He made himself obsolete. At a certain point, he stayed in the background so that his Son could emerge.

This 5th week of Lent is a great time to decide what kind of father you are and strive to be. St. Joseph was the human father that was obedient to God, rooted with love and forgiveness like a grain of wheat cultivated by Our Lord. Deepen your faith by striving to be like St. Joseph who God blessed to be the guardian for Jesus.

SAINT PATRICK. BISHOP **Feast Day March 17th**

St. Patrick may be the patron of Ireland, but he was actually born in Britain, in the late 4th century AD. Surprisingly, he was not raised with a strong

emphasis on religion. Education was not particularly stressed during his childhood either.

He arrived in Ireland as a slave. At the age of 16, St. Patrick was seized from his family's home by a group of Irish pirates, who took him to Ireland where the teenage Patrick was enslaved for six years. He worked as a shepherd for some of this period.

St. Patrick's mission in Ireland was twofold. He was to minister to the Christians who already existed in Ireland, as well as to convert the Irish who were not yet believers. Cleverly, he used traditional rituals to bridge the gap between widely held pagan beliefs and Christianity, such as using bonfires to celebrate Easter, and creating the Celtic cross, which incorporated pagan symbols, to make it seem more appealing to venerate.

According to his own writing in the Confession of St. Patrick, it was this period in his life where he really discovered his faith, and his belief in God. He spent hours praying and eventually converted fully to Christianity. After six years of captivity, St. Patrick heard a voice telling him his ship was ready to take him home: he travelled 200 miles to the nearest port and managed to persuade a captain to let him stow away onboard his ship.

He was traditionally associated with the color blue. Today we associate St. Patrick - and Ireland - with the color green, he was originally depicted wearing blue robes. The particular shade (known today as azure blue) was originally named St. Patrick's blue. Technically today, this shade remains Ireland's official heraldic color. The association with green came as a form of rebellion: as discontent with English rule grew, it was seen as a sign of dissent and rebellion to wear a green shamrock rather than the ordained blue. HAPPY ST. PATRICK'S DAY !!

Prior to the baptism, parents must attend a Baptism Preparation Class which is designed to instruct the parents about the teachings of the church regarding Baptism, and to offer assistance in the spiritual preparation for their child's reception of the first of the Sacraments of the Church.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

March 17, 2024

Parishioners who are contemplating the Sacrament of Matrimony should contact the Pastor and mutually agree upon a date at least a year prior to the Wedding. The Church takes the preparation for the Sacrament of Matrimony very seriously, and requires completion of the Diocesan Marriage Preparation Program six months before the wedding. The normative time for weddings is Saturday between 10:00 AM and 1:30 PM. Weddings are not celebrated on major holidays, nor on the first weekend of June in deference to Ordination of Priests each year at that time. Either the Bride or the Groom must be a practicing member of Sacred Heart Parish in order to request a wedding date.
