


### ONLINE MASS WITH FATHER BUTERA

# KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS FOOD BANK DONATION UPDATE

Due to the generosity of our Sacred Heart parishioners, our Council of the Knights of Columbus delivered 144 pounds of non-perishable items to the Bath Area Food Bank on March 13, bringing our year-to-date total to 2,792 pounds. This was the 10th donation for the 2023-24 Fraternal Year. Our next donation will be made to the St Vincent DePaul Food Bank. Supreme Council of the Knights of Columbus rebates \$100, up to \$500 annually, to local Councils for each 1,000 pounds of food delivered. This rebate is then passed on by our Council to the Food Banks; THANK YOU for your past donations. The need in our communities is still great with current economic conditions; please continue to support this worthwhile endeavor.

### WHAT IS DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY?

In a series of revelations to St. Maria Faustina Kowalska in the 1930s, our Lord called for a special feast day to be celebrated on the Sunday after Easter. Today, we know that feast as Divine Mercy Sunday, named by Pope St. John Paul II at the canonization of St. Faustina on April 30, 2000. The Lord expressed His will with regard to this feast in His very first revelation to St. Faustina. The most comprehensive revelation can be found in her *Diary* entry 699:

My daughter, tell the whole world about My inconceivable mercy. I desire that the Feast of Mercy be a refuge and a shelter for all souls, and especially for poor sinners. On that day the very depths of My tender mercy are open. I pour out a whole ocean of graces upon those souls who approach the fount of My mercy. The soul that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion shall obtain complete forgiveness of sins and punishment. On that day are opened all the divine floodgates through which graces flow. Let no soul fear to draw near to Me, even though its sins be as scarlet. My mercy is so great that no mind, be it of man or of angel, will be able to fathom it throughout all eternity. Everything that exists has come from the very depths of My most tender mercy. Every soul in its relation to Me will contemplate My love and mercy throughout eternity. The Feast of Mercy emerged from My very depths of tenderness. It is My desire that it be solemnly celebrated on the first Sunday after Easter. Mankind will not have peace until it turns to the Fount of My mercy.

In all, there were fourteen revelations recorded from Jesus concerning His desire for this feast. Nevertheless, Divine Mercy Sunday is NOT a feast based solely on St. Faustina's revelations. Indeed, it is not primarily about St. Faustina — nor is it altogether a new feast. The Second Sunday of Easter was already a solemnity as the Octave Day of Easter. The title "Divine Mercy Sunday" does, however, highlight the meaning of the day.

Please join the Lay Dominicans in preparation for Mercy Sunday Feast Day. The Divine Mercy Novena starts on Good Friday, March 29 after Stations of the Cross at noon, continues privately on 3/30 and 3/31, in community after weekday Mass Monday, April 1 through Friday, April 5, and ends privately on April 6, day nine.

Divine Mercy Sunday is April 7th and celebration will begin after the 11:00 am Mass with Exposition of the Most Blessed Sacrament, the Rosary, 1:00 pm Confessions, Divine Mercy meditations, and concluding at 3:00 pm with the Chaplet of Divine Mercy and Benediction. Look for the Divine Mercy Novena prayer pamphlets in the Church Vestibule. Please take advantage of Jesus' offering of this great grace of mercy!

### **PRO-LIFE CORNER**

The big controversy these days is all about IVF (Invitro Fertilization). Layman's term; conceiving a child outside of the womb. It is an \$8 billion dollar industry across our country and leads to "manufacturing" 100,000 children a year. Always follow the money trail in these types of issues.

The Catholic Church strongly advocates against IVF. For starters, it divorces procreation from the unitive love between parents. The motivating issue is an emotional empathy for the infertile couples who want children. As much as we can feel sorry for these couples, having children is a blessing from God, it is not a right. The IVF industry plays on these emotions by charging exorbitant prices, even though most health insurances do not cover the cost.

The moral issues connected with IVF are numerous and complicated. Some of the more obvious ones are: women are impregnated not by a husband but by a technician with a pipette. In addition, excess embryos are created, with some implanted, some deep frozen and others destroyed. If all implanted embryos take, one or more are often selectively aborted.

### GODPARENT/SPONSOR ELIGIBILITY FORMS

In order to act as a godparent for Baptism or a Sponsor for Confirmation, one must be a Catholic in good standing. Specifically this means Mass attendance every Sunday (Exodus 20:8), striving to live the moral precepts of the Church, and if married, a valid marriage in the Catholic Church.

#### THE SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

is celebrated on Sunday at Noon. If you are a parishioner and would like to schedule a Baptism, please contact the Parish Office. Prior to the baptism, parents must attend a Baptism Preparation Class which is designed to instruct the parents about the teachings of the church regarding Baptism, and to offer assistance in the spiritual preparation for their child's reception of the first of the Sacraments of the Church.

### **SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE**

Parishioners who are contemplating the Sacrament of Matrimony should contact the Pastor and mutually agree upon a date at least a year prior to the Wedding. The Church takes the preparation for the Sacrament of Matrimony very seriously, and requires completion of the Diocesan Marriage Preparation Program six months before the wedding. The normative time for weddings is Saturday between 10:00 AM and 1:30 PM. Weddings are not celebrated on major holidays, nor on the first weekend of June in deference to Ordination of Priests each year at that time. Either the Bride or the Groom must be a practicing member of Sacred Heart Parish in order to request a wedding date.

#### **COMMUNION TO THE HOMEBOUND**

A Priest or Deacon will visit monthly. Extraordinary Ministers visit those who wish to receive more often. Always notify us about the homebound parishioners who wish to be visited.
