


FLOWERS ON THE ALTAR

THE NATIVITY OF SAINT JOHN THE BAPTIST Feast Day-June 24, 2024

John the Baptist provided a model of heroic holiness. He publicly condemned hypocrisy immorality, calling all to repentance. He challenged the greed and materialism of his day, following a

life of poverty, simplicity and selflessness that inspired not only his contemporaries, but also the later pioneers of Christian monasticism.

Wherever John went, he was surrounded by vast crowds and followers, some thinking he was the Messiah. Yet he didn't take advantage of these people. Rather, he told them clearly that he wasn't who they thought he was, and that they must experience a conversion of heart in preparation for the Messiah.

When Jesus began His ministry, John sent his disciples to Jesus and then faded into the background, humbly accepting his diminishing role with the words: "He [Christ] must increase; I must decrease" (In 3:30). He willingly gave up his life and lived for Jesus.

John's message to the people so many years ago was that the Lord is imminent, so we must be prepared. St. John and Jesus knew each other even before they were born. The importance of St. John's birth is to reinforce the message of who Jesus and God are. Do you believe in Our Lord and Savior as St. John the Baptist did when they meet again at the Jordon River? On the solemnity of the Nativity of St. John the Baptist, the Church renews that message.



PRO-LIFE CORNER

While attempting to read the gospel this past Sunday, I was being drowned out by a very loud baby from the back of the Church. "Dah, Dah, blah, blah" she wailed. It was delightful! We used to have a whole chorus of babies making little, or not so little, baby noises. No longer. Babies have become rarer. But it seems like we are having an up-take of them lately.

There was a time in my Deaconate ministry when I would do a baptism every first Sunday of the Month, while the pastor would do one every third Sunday. Sometimes with more than one baby being baptized. That has not happened for years. Now I am lucky if I do 3 or 4 per year.

So, keep bringing those babies to Church. Don't worry about their chiming in when the priest or Deacon starts to preach or read. Scientifically: "Babies can elicit oxytocin release and we know that the oxytocin system interacts with the dopamine reward system." So yes, the loud baby in the back row is making everybody in Church a little happier by belting out their version of the homily. Maybe that is God's way of making the homily a little more acceptable to the minds and hearts of the parishioners? Who knows?

is given to those who are seriously ill and in danger of death. When there is danger of death, please call the Pastor anytime, day or night.

GODPARENT/SPONSOR ELIGIBILITY FORMS

In order to act as a godparent for Baptism or a Sponsor for Confirmation, one must be a Catholic in good standing. Specifically this means Mass attendance every Sunday (Exodus 20:8), striving to live the moral precepts of the Church, and if married, a valid marriage in the Catholic Church.

THE SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

is celebrated on Sunday at Noon. If you are a parishioner and would like to schedule a Baptism, please contact the Parish Office. Prior to the baptism, parents must attend a Baptism Preparation Class which is designed to instruct the parents about the teachings of the church regarding Baptism, and to offer assistance in the spiritual preparation for their child's reception of the first of the Sacraments of the Church.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

Parishioners who are contemplating the Sacrament of Matrimony should contact the Pastor and mutually agree upon a date at least a year prior to the Wedding. The Church takes the preparation for the Sacrament of Matrimony very seriously, and requires completion of the Diocesan Marriage Preparation Program six months before the wedding. The normative time for weddings is Saturday between 10:00 AM and 1:30 PM. Weddings are not celebrated on major holidays, nor on the first weekend of June in deference to Ordination of Priests each year at that time. Either the Bride or the Groom must be a practicing member of Sacred Heart Parish in order to request a wedding date.

COMMUNION TO THE HOMEBOUND

A Priest or Deacon will visit monthly. Extraordinary Ministers visit those who wish to receive more often. Always notify us about the homebound parishioners who wish to be visited.

RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS
