IMPORTANT NOTE REGARDING THE RECEPTION OF SACRAMENTS

The location where you receive your sacraments is governed by the territorial boundaries of the Parish within which you live, as prescribed by the Code of Canon Law. As a reminder, and to prevent confusion or delay when the time nears for sacraments (and sacramental the preparation), reception is <u>not governed by</u> where one attends school nor by where you attend Mass nor receive Religious Education. For example, if you live in the territorial boundaries of Sacred Heart of Jesus Parish, and your 2nd grader attends Good Shepherd School in Northampton, they will receive their Religious Education from Good Shepherd School, but receive the sacrament of First Holy Communion at Sacred Heart of Jesus.

PRO-LIFE CORNER

Where have all of the babies gone? Not that long ago I used to do a baptism every first Sunday of the Month, and often had more than one baby to baptize. The pastor did a baptism on the third Sunday of the Month. These days I do a committal graveside service on average of twice a Month, and very infrequently have a baptism.

Things have changed. Things always change. We are an aging parish, that exists in an aging country, that exists in an aging World. So, what should our pro-life vision look like? Maybe we should concentrate more on the euthanasia issues versus abortion. The predominant "culture of death" (JPII term) seems very much in favor of euthanizing our aging population.

The media, TV and movies, take it for granted that what they would call "mercy killing" is a very positive advancement. The culture of death people, like to use euphemisms, so the term "euthanasia" is illegal in all states, however, "assisted suicide" is legal in 9 states in addition to Washington D.C. Very confusing. The results are the same no matter what label they want to give it, and it is clearly against God's will and the clear teachings of the Roman Catholic Church.

THE ASSUMPTION OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY Feast Day—August 15th

The word "assumption" is rooted in the Latin verb assumere, which means "to take to oneself." The doctrine of Mary's Assumption teaches that Jesus took his mother to Himself in Heaven at the end

of her life, just as Enoch had been taken up body and soul to Heaven at the end of their lives (<u>Genesis 5:24</u>).

In discussing Mary's Assumption, the Catholic Church teaches that Mary's body was glorified immediately at the end of her earthly life. Mary's saintly life started when she herself was conceived and God chose her to bring Jesus into this world so that he could be our salvation. God granted Mary a pure life to bestow the joy of being Jesus' mother, He then gave her a pure death. Thus, unlike other mortal beings who must wait until the end of the world for our bodily resurrection, Mary, as Jesus's mother, was given the divine gift of being taken body and soul to Heaven upon her death.

Importantly, the Assumption of Mary is unlike the Ascension of Jesus. Jesus Christ ascended into Heaven by His own power. In contrast, Mary is believed to have been taken up into Heaven by God.

SACRAMENT OF ANOINTING OF THE SICK

is given to those who are seriously ill and in danger of death. When there is danger of death, please call the Pastor anytime, day or night.

GODPARENT/SPONSOR ELIGIBILITY FORMS

In order to act as a godparent for Baptism or a Sponsor for Confirmation, one must be a Catholic in good standing. Specifically this means Mass attendance every Sunday (Exodus 20:8), striving to live the moral precepts of the Church, and if married, a valid marriage in the Catholic Church.

THE SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

is celebrated on Sunday at Noon. If you are a parishioner and would like to schedule a Baptism, please contact the Parish Office. Prior to the baptism, parents must attend a Baptism Preparation Class which is designed to instruct the parents about the teachings of the church regarding Baptism, and to offer assistance in the spiritual preparation for their child's reception of the first of the Sacraments of the Church.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

August 11, 2024

Parishioners who are contemplating the Sacrament of Matrimony should contact the Pastor and mutually agree upon a date at least a year prior to the Wedding. The Church takes the preparation for the Sacrament of Matrimony very seriously, and requires completion of the Diocesan Marriage Preparation Program six months before the wedding. The normative time for weddings is Saturday between 10:00 AM and 1:30 PM. Weddings are not celebrated on major holidays, nor on the first weekend of June in deference to Ordination of Priests each year at that time. Either the Bride or the Groom must be a practicing member of Sacred Heart Parish in order to request a wedding date.

COMMUNION TO THE HOMEBOUND

A Priest or Deacon will visit monthly. Extraordinary Ministers visit those who wish to receive more often. Always notify us about the homebound parishioners who wish to be visited.

RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS
