



PRO-LIFE CORNER

Say good-bye to the English. Apparently Great Britain is considering changing their laws that outlaw "assisted suicide." Presently a doctor can be jailed for up to 14 years if caught assisting a patient to commit suicide. However, a new bill is being proposed to change that law. The new bill is defined as: "Assisted Dying for terminally adult patients who have less than 6 months to live." Notice they do not like the term "suicide."

All of these compromises start out sounding relatively reasonable, although still morally wrong. Notice that it's just for adults with a terminal illness who have only 6 months to live. Canada, which started out with similar restrictions, is now at a point where the patient can get assistance in killing themselves even if they just have an "incurable" disease, not just a terminal condition.

In addition, euthanasia for patients with dementia is now legal in Canada, as well as Belgium, Colombia, Luxembourg and the Netherlands. Of course, the natural question would be, "How does someone with dementia decide that they want to commit suicide?" Also, ten states in the United States allow some form of euthanasia. It's a slippery slope, folks!

SACRAMENT OF ANOINTING OF THE SICK

is given to those who are seriously ill and in danger of death. When there is danger of death, please call the Pastor anytime, day or night.

GODPARENT/SPONSOR ELIGIBILITY FORMS

In order to act as a godparent for Baptism or a Sponsor for Confirmation, one must be a Catholic in good standing. Specifically this means Mass attendance every Sunday (Exodus 20:8), striving to live the moral precepts of the Church, and if married, a valid marriage in the Catholic Church.

THE SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

is celebrated on Sunday at Noon. If you are a parishioner and would like to schedule a Baptism, please contact the Parish Office. Prior to the baptism, parents must attend a Baptism Preparation Class which is designed to instruct the parents about the teachings of the church regarding Baptism, and to offer assistance in the spiritual preparation for their child's reception of the first of the Sacraments of the Church.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

Parishioners who are contemplating the Sacrament of Matrimony should contact the Pastor and mutually agree upon a date at least a year prior to the Wedding. The Church takes the preparation for the Sacrament of Matrimony very seriously, and requires completion of the Diocesan Marriage Preparation Program six months before the wedding. The normative time for weddings is Saturday between 10:00 AM and 1:30 PM. Weddings are not celebrated on major holidays, nor on the first weekend of June in deference to Ordination of Priests each year at that time. Either the Bride or the Groom must be a practicing member of Sacred Heart Parish in order to request a wedding date.

COMMUNION TO THE HOMEBOUND

A Priest or Deacon will visit monthly. Extraordinary Ministers visit those who wish to receive more often. Always notify us about the homebound parishioners who wish to be visited.
